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Book of Records of the proceedings of
the first Presbyterian Congregation in Cranbury
commencing from the Fifteenth day of May, in
the year of our LORD Eighteen Hundred and Twenty

Which was Presented to the Congregation by Peter Hosford
Sandby and at a Meeting of the Congregation they
unanimously Agreed to confess this Stone & suspend him

May the 13. 1820 —

At a meeting of the first Presbyterian Congregation in
Cranbury held the 13 day of May 1820 agreeably to Publick
notice previously given from the Pulpit, the following appointments
were made into Resolutions adopted, viz.

Mr Ezra Baldwin was appointed Moderator, and Mr John Day
Esq^r Secretary.

The object of the meeting being stated viz. to make a call to
some Gentleman in the Ministry to be the stated Pastor of this
Church, and it was also further stated that exertions had been
made to obtain a neighbouring Minister to attend on the
occasion, but that they had failed in succeeding on account
of previous engagements, where on Motion it was

Resolved that the Congregation now proceed to accomplish the
Business for which it was convened, notwithstanding the absence
of an attending Minister, An address was then made to the
Supreme Ruler of the Universe by Mr John Dawson one of the
Members of the Session, adapted to the occasion, and circumstances
of the congregation, after which the nomination being called
for it appeared that the Reverend Symmes C. Henry was the
only Gentleman nominated, whereupon it was

1. Resolved unanimously that a call be made out for the
Reverend Symmes C. Henry to be the stated Pastor of this
Congregation —

2. Resolved on motion unanimously that the Salary to the
Pastor shall be the same as that heretofore given to the Reverend
George J. Wood late Pastor of this congregation, to
viz. One hundred Dollars a year payable half yearly, also
together with the use and profit of the parsonage.

3. Resolved that the above call be signed by the Trustees
in behalf of the congregation —

4. Resolved that a Committee consisting of five members be
selected to present unto the Presbytery the call

Above agreed upon by the congregation for which purpose
Rev George Morris, Richard Reid, John Dackson, Abraham
Bergan, and John Day Esq were appointed.

5. Resolved that that a Committee consisting of two members
be appointed to wait upon the said Reverend Symmes Harvey
and present to him a copy of the foregoing proceedings
for which purpose Joseph McNamee Esq and James R.
McNamee was appointed.

May the 19. 1821

May the 19. 1821 Agreeably to Publick notice given from the Pulpit
of the first Presbyterian Congregation in Cranbury for the purpose of
choosing Trustees, and to devise some plan to finish the repairs
of the parsonage, the congregation proceeded and chose Major Richard
Reid Moderator, and Peter C. Bergan Secretary.

The following persons were nominated and chosen as Trustees
Rev Major Richard Reid, Abraham Bergan, George Morris,
David Briggs, Peter C. Bergan, Aaron Larr, and
Robert McNamee.

On motion Resolved that so much of the money as is necessary
to finish the repairs on the parsonage be taken out from
the sum Bequeathed to the Church in and by Mr. Lot Will
and Testament of the late Deacon, and to be replaced
again by the Board of Trustees when convenient.

June the 23. 1821.

At a meeting of the first Presbyterian Congregation in Cranbury held
this 23. day of June 1821 previous notice having been first given
from the pulpit, the following Resolutions were adopted on several
appointments made viz. Mr. Rev. Symmes C. Harvey was chosen
Moderator, and Peter C. Bergan Secretary — after which the
Bairns of the day was introduced by a prayer adapted to the occasion
by the Moderator.

On Motion Resolved unanimously that a suitable imprent
of the Pulpit in the Gallery for the accommodation of the Clerks, or
leaders of Saundsmere, and that Joseph McNamee, Peter C. Bergan
and Aaron Larr be a committee to have them properly erected for
said purpose within the ensuing week, after which Richard Reid,
was chosen the Leader of Saundsmere, and William H. Mount,
John Nichols, Peter White, and Christopher Howell Epistles.

On Motion Resolved unanimously that a standing Committee consisting
of three members be appointed annually hereafter, whose duty it shall
be to Record in a Book to be provided for that purpose, all the proceedings
of the Congregational meetings commenced from the time of
making for the Earl of Elgin Congregation for the Rev. Symmes C. Harvey
to be the Pastor of the Church. But that it shall also be the duty of said
Committee to make out a correct map or draught of all the houses on the
Church, designating their numbers, and by whom occupied, stating
the value that are worth up, and in what part, and also to make out a
list of all those persons that are in arrears for salary and how much, and
make report thereof to the Board of Trustees at their annual spring
meeting yearly and every year, and it shall further be the duty of the
said Committee to find all the vacant, or unoccupied lots in the
Church, to such persons as may apply for the same description.

John J. A. Howell, Joseph McNamee, and Samuel Wilson are appointed
the Committee for the purpose aforesaid for the ensuing year.

Ordered that the proceedings of the day be signed by the Moderator and
Secretary, after which the whole was concluded with an appropriate
prayer by the Moderator.

At a meeting of the first Presbyterian congregation of Plainbush, held in the church, agreeable to notice from the Presid. on Saturday the 27th May 1837 at 4 o'clock P.M. for the purpose of appointing Seven Trustees, to said Congregation, for the ensuing year; — Southwicks being present appointed Chairman & Peter H. Clarke, Secy.

The Meeting being duly organized. The Secretary read a report, detailing the delinquency of Hall & the number of dissenters ^{and} in said Church.

Resolution passed that this meeting go into the appointment of Trustees.

Before the votes were taken, it was moved and carried that an assistant secretary be appointed, whereupon John J. Duncan, was appointed. On Motion, Resolved by the meeting, That any person, not having an actual interest in said Church, shall be considered an illegal voter.

Before the meeting went into the election it was moved, that measures be taken to raise sufficient funds to defray the expence of repairing the grave yard. On this Motion the meeting refused to act — consequently it was withdrawn — at the same time it was suggested by several, among them, that it be left discretionary to the trustees, to raise the suitable funds by subscription, or otherwise as they may deem expedient.

After the votes were counted, it was moved by W. Hutchinson & seconded that the ticket thus given, be canvassed. — After a considerable expression of unpleasant feeling by a number of individuals, W. Hutchinson begged leave to withdraw the motion. — The Secretary then called upon the Chairman to promulgate to the meeting the result of the election.

The Chairman (after calling to order) stated that one ticket had received fifty votes, the other twenty as they stood upon the paper.

The Chairman then directed the Secretary to read up the names of the following ticket, that had received the fifty votes — viz —

Resolved ^{This meeting are of opinion, that the best and} fairest mode of erecting a new Church, is by subscription with the proviso, that the pews be sold after its completion at public Auction. — *(A valuation of the same being, previously made by the Trustees, subject however to an annual adjustment, a statement which the Trustees may think proper to keep for the support of the Gospel.)* — *Signed that upon such sale, of the sum given for a pew, the subscriber shall exceed the amount of his subscription, the overplus to be paid by him, and in case it should fall short, the balance not to be refused, it being also understood, that no individual shall have the privilege of purchasing more than one pew with his subscription money.* —

4^d. Resolved ^{That a subscription on the above plan be now} opened, with a view of testing the strength of this meeting, believing that in all such undertakings, one of the first and most important steps to secure the success of the enterprise, is to encourage the timid to withdraw the scruples to silence opposition and to put their count in action, is to shew by deeds and by sacred pledges that the necessary funds can be raised. —

5^d. Resolved ^{That the board of Trustees be committed to} carry the foregoing resolutions into effect, they shall

decide upon the size, the plan, and the kind of building to be erected, to procure the materials, employ workmen, and make all contracts, necessary for the completion of the same. They shall appoint one of their number, to whom such instructions shall pass by the one month after his subscription, every two months - whose duty it shall be to receive and distribute all money thus raised, to defray the necessary expenses, to keep a correct account of the same, and to have it ready at all times for the inspection of the congregation - He shall also exercise a general superintendance over the whole business, and shall be allowed a reasonable compensation for his time and services.

Resol^e. In view of the pecuniary objections found as far as that they are not able to purchase a piece of land to erect a church upon the plan suggested above, and that in such a case they fear their privilege might be abridged - This meeting resolved that it is their unanimous conviction, and belief, that a large building on the contemplated plan, will afford to much a better and a cheaper accommodation than the present one - as some of the pews will be removed especially for rent, and also as there will be many holding of new pews, to let out or a few sets to applicants.

By-Laws and Regulations of the Brainard Cemetery

Falling under an Act of the Legislature
Authorizing the incorporation of Rural Cemetery
associations. Approved March 14, 1851.

Article 1st

The old grave yard of the 1st Presbyterian Church
at Cranberry N. J. together with that new plot
of ground recently added from the Parsonage of
said church shall hereafter be called the Brainard
Cemetery; and it belongs entirely and is subject
only to the jurisdiction of the congregation of the same
church.

Article 2nd

Each year, at the regular Spring meeting of the

Congregation, a committee of five shall be appointed,
denominated the Cemetery Committee, whose duty
shall be to see that the grounds are kept in order,
to make such improvements as are necessary,
to attend to the sale of lots, and to fix the price
upon these. This committee shall be subject to
the direction and control of the highest powers,
the Trustees of the Church,

Article 3rd

The committee shall meet the first Monday
after their election, and afterwards upon their own
adjournments, or the call of the Chairman.
At their first meeting they shall choose from
their number a Chairman, a Secretary, and a
Treasurer; and these all shall hold their offices
for one year.

Article 4th

It shall be the duty of the Chairman, or in his
absence, of the Chairman pro tem to preside at all
meetings of the Committee, to inform the trustees
of the church of all sales of burial lots, to receive
the monies for these and hand them over
to the Treasurer.

Article 5th

It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep correct minutes of all the transactions of the Committee, and to certify to the Treasurer what bills the committee have ordered to be paid.

Article 6th

It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to keep correct books of accounts of all the receipts and disbursements of the committee, to file all vouchers for money expended, to pay no money without the certificate of the Secretary to the effect that the committee have ordered the payment, to safely keep all monies received, to obey all orders of the Committee in relation thereto, and to produce any books or papers in his possession before the Committee upon the requisition of the Chairman. He shall also be required to give satisfactory security in such sum as the Committee shall direct for the due performance of his duty.

Article 7th

When any lot or lots have been sold the trustees of the church shall be informed thereof by the Chairman of the Committee and the President of the board of trustees only shall seal sign execute acknowledge and

Deliver all deeds to purchasers of burial lots and such execution acknowledgement and delivery shall forever be recognized as valid and effectual in law.

Article 8th

In the cemetery shall be a plot of ground in which those who have no lots may bury. Persons belonging to the congregation of the 1st Presbyterian Church may bury here without expense, but all who do not must pay such a sum as the Committee agree upon, and this sum must be paid or secured before the burial takes place.

Article 9th

All monies received from the sale of lots shall be applied exclusively to the Cemetery, and if at any time there may be a sufficient surplus, this shall be properly invested and the interest applied to the improvement of the grounds.

Article 10th

The sexton of the church shall have charge of the yard, subject however to the direction of the Committee. It shall be his duty

To have a general care of the grounds; to report to the Committee any repairs which ought to be made, to inform persons having graves lying in the yard whose graves are in a bad condition, to mow the yard twice a year, for which he shall receive a compensation, to keep the keys of the yard, to prevent any trespassing, either by man or beast within the grounds, to attend to the digging and sodding of graves, at the price fixed by the Committee, to break no ground for any person until they have complied with the regulations, and to obey all the instructions of the Committee in relation to the cemetery.

Article 11th

In each deed given for lots shall be inserted that the owner acknowledges himself subject to these Regulations and Laws, and in case any purchaser of a lot does not abide by them, his right to the lot shall be forfeited and he shall thenceforth not be permitted to buy or said lot until he has manifested his willingness to

abide by the laws, and paid one half of the original cost of the lot.

Article 12th

Owners may ornament their lots with shrubs and flowers as they see fit, but they shall plant no trees thereon without permission of the committee.

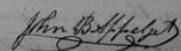

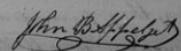

A motion was made that a committee of five be appointed to look over the property and suggest what was necessary to be done.
That Committee consisted of Dr. Chamberlin, John B. Pearce, A. C. Symmes, A. M. Dawson and H. C. Symmes.

At a late meeting the above Committee reported to a like meeting of the official boards the results of their researches and advised the painting of the outside of the church building complete renovation of the interior with decoration, painting of stained glass windows and some method of improved illumination and estimated cost at about \$2000.00 having obtained quite accurate bids and contracts.

A Committee was appointed consisting of Dr. Chamberlin, David Ellett and John B. Pearce to collect contributions to be paid only upon subscription of the sum of \$2000.00.

Report of Pastor, Congregational Meeting 1935.

The pastor, Rev. F.B. Everett, presented the following report to the meeting:-

At the time of the merger, 708 names were left on the roll of the combined church, 402 from the First Church, and 306 from the second. Since that time (March 7th) seven have taken their letters, and one member has died, leaving the membership an even 700. During the past year, there was a total of seventeen additions to both churches, and a loss of 109, leaving a net loss to both churches of 92. This is due to a careful revision of the roll, whereby a goodly number were placed on the return roll.

The present Sunday school membership is reported as 837.

Last year, the First Church raised for congregational expenses \$6700 and for special objects \$200, and for benevolences, \$2053. The Second Church in the same period raised \$2797 for congregational expenses, and \$1023 for benevolences. This makes a grand total of \$13,773 for all purposes from both churches, of which the benevolent share was 23076.

We report at present sixteen elders, seventeen deacons, and nine trustees.

During the year, there were in both churches five adult baptisms, and twelve infant baptisms.

The election of three trustees to replace those retiring by rotation was called for by the Chairman. Following a discussion it was voted to use the ballots prepared by the Trustees, bearing the names of six members or their, by a vote of 32 yes, 11 no. It was announced that additional names could be written in if desired. The ballots were distributed, and after having been voted, were collected and counted by the tellers appointed, who announced that the three having the highest number of votes were Walter J. Applegate, J. Warren Sly and Leo J. Flavian. These men were declared to be elected as Trustees for the next three years.

It was voted that Mrs. Ethel Signore continue as Church Treasurer and that Elmer Edsell be continued as Sexton.

The reports of the Auditing Committee were read and accepted with thanks.

It was regularly voted that the action of the Board of Trustees for the past year be approved.

Mr. E. S. Bradley spoke regarding the removal for the former Second Church following which it was voted that the sum of \$2,54 from the sale of the building, together with an additional sum of \$7,000 from the sale of property of the former Second Church

be set aside for the erection of a suitable memorial. It was also voted that the trust fund of \$475 of the late George Bryce be turned over to the Westminster Cemetery Association in conformity with the provision in his will.

Mr. Stultz next called on Mr. William J. Hanson, chairman of the Committee on the Improvement of the Chapel, who told of the committee's activities in trying to determine the wants and needs of the Sunday School and others interested, and having engaged the architectural firm of Kenner & Fink of Philadelphia, to prepare preliminary plans for the improvements. Mr. Werner showed slides of various types of Church architecture from early Gothic to modern types as a background, then presented views of the elevation and floor plan of the proposed improvements. These were shown several times and fully explained by Mr. Werner, who also answered numerous questions by the members. A sketch notin picture was also shown showing the lower departments of the Sunday School in session during a March 31, to show some of the existing conditions. Following a discussion and the proposal of several minor changes, it was regularly voted that the Committee be authorized to proceed with final plans and construction along the lines as shown, providing that the amount of \$1,500 minimum be raised by subscription within a period of 1½ years, in which case the sum of about \$9,000 now available in Chapel funds be used and the balance of not more than \$7,000 be forwarded from the funds for a total of \$29,000. A committee to supervise the construction was named, to be E. S. Buckley, Fred Burns, Jr., and W. J. Hanson. There being no further business, the voting adjourned to the Chapel for refreshments and a social hour.

during the past year and have given more thought
to the various subjects under discussion than

Mr. Albert Cocker, chairman of the music committee, read the report of Mrs. Cocker, president of the choir. The choir has made good progress this past year under the direction of Mr. Tuller. There were special musical services on Palm Sunday and at Christmas time.

The renovation of the organ has increased the effectiveness of the musical part of our service.

Mr. Remske, superintendent, reported for the church school. All departments of the Sunday school are now using the youth budget plan.

The enrollment shows an increase of approximately 30% over last year, as there are now 235 pupils, 33 teachers and officers, 33 on the reading roll and 11 in the home department.

The church school sponsored a strawberry festival and was enabled thereby to contribute \$226.67 to the organ fund. It is expected that this strawberry festival will become an annual event.

The total receipts for the church school for the year were \$2,015.12. Of this amount \$1,334.70 was used for operating expenses and \$889.44 was given to benevolent outside of Banbury.

Mrs. Charles Symmes read the report of Miss Odie Rice, chairman of the flower committee. Twenty-three bouquets had been sent to sick persons during the year, and ten bouquets to the mothers of newborn babies. For these \$48.55 was expended.

Mrs. Henry Reid reported for the Letch and Hatter Society. During the year they had given the usual St. Patrick's Day supper and Election Day supper. The former showed a profit of \$73.56, and the latter a profit of \$861.48. They also gave a wedding reception in September which yielded a profit of \$4.00.

During the year the Society purchased additional goods for the choir, a number of trays and cooking utensils for the kitchen, material for a United Nations flag, and cabinets for the manse kitchen. The Letch and Hatter also contributed \$500.00 to the organ fund.

Mrs. Walter White reported for the Helping Hand Society. During the year the Society took in \$188.28. The chief sources of income were the Easter Seal supper profits from the calendar, the variety show, cake sales and dues for the year. The society gave \$225.00 to the organ fund, and expended approximately \$100.00 on our various missionary enterprises.

Mrs. John Bruce reported for the Non-Bethelhood.

The interest in the Men's Brotherhood has not been as great during this past year as had been hoped for, but it is intended to carry on for another year to see if this organization can make a place for itself in our church.

Mr. Franklin Bennett gave the secretary's report for the deacons and Charles Symmes reported as treasurer of the Deacons' fund. \$10.15 had been expended during the year for the relief of members of the congregation. The fund now stands at \$529.38.

Mr. Norman Knight reported for the session. He noted that several members of the session were on committees of presbytery; Albert Conklin as trustee of presbytery, Ernest Campbell as a member of the committee of national missions, and Armstrong Bennett on the presbytery committee for Christian education.

He reported that Presbyterian Life had been sent to each member of the congregation with rather unexpectedly good results.

On October 28 Dr. Lester Lee spoke at the Reformation Day service in our church. The church was completely filled and the service was one of great significance.

Miss Green of Seward, Alaska, one of the three missionaries for whom we contribute considerable support, visited us three times during this year when she was in the United States on furlough. She spoke of the smoothness with which all church affairs were running, and of the effectiveness of the work which was now being done by the church as a whole.

Mr. Telmuth gave his report as pastor. He spoke of the 5% increase in bimonthly for the year, and the 10% increase in average attendance at church services, the various church organizations had been more active during the year; the church properties were maintained in excellent condition, the renovation of the organ, and the installation of a new heating system in the church, added much to the effectiveness of our services and the comfort of the congregation.

Mr. Telmuth wished that participation in the various activities of the church could be more widely spread, so that a greater number of individuals would take part.

Minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Congregation
January 11, 1952.

The annual meeting of the congregation was held in the Parish House on January 11, 1952 at 8:00 P.M.

The Factor called the meeting to order and asked the clerk of sessions to act as clerk of the meeting.

The clerk read the call for the meeting and the call was duly found in order.

Mrs. Dorothy Lennahan reported for the Ladies and Shattet Society, indicating that the spring and fall suppers together had yielded a profit of \$2,469. The society had remodeled the kitchen in the Parochial House and had turned the basement room of the Parochial House into an attractive recreation room for the young people.

Mr. Aubrey Dugay reported for the adult choir. "The Seven Last Words" had been given the past Easter. An interesting Christmas program had been given on December 16 with a record attendance for this service. The interest of the congre-

gation in the choir music seems to be increasing.

Mr. and Mrs. Harry Dubber reported that the Adult, Junior and Youth choirs had continued their activities during the year with considerable success.

Mr. Robert Vandenberg gave the report of Mr. Rommels, superintendent of the Sunday School, regarding the continued use of the Youth Budget plan for all departments. The Sunday School had given a strawberry festival donating the proceeds, \$205.25 to the organ fund. The total number in the Church School roll showed an increase of 82, rising from 267 to 349.

In the absence of Mrs. Edith Rue Mr. Palmer gave the report for the flower committee, indicating that about the usual number of flowers had been contributed to the church services and distributed to persons who were ill.

Mr. Albert Becker, in the absence of Mrs. Becker, gave the financial report for the Building Fund Society, indicating a contribution to foreign and national missions of \$227.25. Mrs. John Bruce, in the absence of Mrs. George Kirby, gave a detailed report of the activities of the Society during the year.

Mr. Franklin Bennett reported for the deacons, stating that there had been very few cases requiring assistance from the deacons fund during the past year. Mr. Charles Symmes gave the financial
