receive twenty five dollars for fitting up the church
supplying the necessities of Mr. C. H. in the
first year, and the moderator give him an
order on Mr. John Wry Treasurer of the Legion
for the same: —

The Rev. Symmes C. Henry A. was born at Flemington N. Jersey
 June the 7th 1797. He graduated from the College of Princeton
 in the year 1815; & studied Theology in the Seminary at Princeton.
 He was licensed to preach the Gospel by the Presbytery of Newton
 Oct. 8. 1817; & ordained by the same Presbytery "Sine Titulo" on the
 3rd of May 1818. From the Seminary in May 1818 he went ~~to~~
 to Salem Mass - where he preached for three months as a stated
 supply. He went thence to Rochester N. York where he preached
 for a time. He then preached as an assistant to Dr. Ely in
 Philadelphia for nearly a year. He then spent some
 time travelling & preaching in Virginia, & especially in Norfolk.
 He then, in an uncertain state of mind came to Princeton.
 And Dr. Spafford Woodhull having just removed from
 Cranbury to Princeton, he was invited to preach in
 Cranbury, & soon received a call to become the Pastor
 of that church. He, at the same time, received
 a call to the 1st Church of N. Brunswick N. Jersey.
 But he accepted the call to Cranbury, & being received
 by the Presbytery of N. Brunswick from the Presbytery of
 Newton on the 2nd of April 1820, was installed Pastor of
 the 1st Church of Cranbury on the 8th of August 1820.
 Here he labored for a period of nearly thirty seven
 years, deciding to live & die with his first charge,
 although called once to Norfolk, & once to the 1st Church

116 During the winter preceding his death his health had been unusually good. But at the same time it was observed that he had been preaching with unusual tenderness & power, so much so that persons were impressed with the thought that he was finishing his work. For many years he had suffered with a bronchial affection, brought on by exposure in attending night services. His last public duty was preaching a funeral sermon in Hightower on the Sabbath preceding his death. Here he was much exposed in the violent state of the weather, & came home with a severe cold, which resulted in a violent inflammation of the bronchial membrane. He was impressed from the first that this was to be his last illness. And in perfect composure he made all the arrangements for his funeral, & gave a few directions as to his worldly affairs. He had never taken his bed during his illness, but died, as himself remarked, in full health & strength. On Sabbath March 22nd 1857 at 3 o'clock P.M. he walked to his bed, & laid himself down just as always slept. In a few moments he exclaimed, "beautiful city, beautiful city; I see the pearly gates opened to receive me." And in ten minutes from his lying down he breath'd his last without a struggle, or a movement of pain. His funeral was attended on Thursday March 26th 1857 by many members of the Presbytery of N. Brunswick, & by a large concourse of his friends. On Monday March 30th 1857 a meeting of the congregation was held when a call was made out for Rev. Joseph G. Symmes of Madison Indiana, & son-in-law of Dr. King, and on the 5th of May 1857 he was installed Pastor of the church by a Committee of the Presbytery of N. Brunswick.

against the house at the side of the door. He asked
me if I would not fall? I said I thought not."

* Meaning her grandmother.

He took hold of my hand, & helped me down; & took me on his lap, & put his hand up under my clothes. I jumped down & sat on the step; & he took my hand, & put it on something, I did not know what it was.

Question by Prosecutor.

Where did he put his hand?

Answer. He put it towards his pantsaloos. I did not like to speak of it. My mother & Ma were in the shop. It was after dark; & the lamp was lighted. I did not see any one passing.

Question by Sevier.

How long were you on his lap?

Answer. About three or four minutes.

Question by same.

Where was Mr. Vandevere, & where were you when he took your hand & did what you say?

Answer. He was sitting on a chair, & I on the bottom step.

Question by Sevier & Prosecutor at once.

Did you say you were on the bottom step?

Answer. I was on the lower step.

Mrs. Catherine M. Doty was called & sworn. 187

Question by the Prosecutor.

Please state what you know of this case!

Answer.

My child did not tell me of this occurrence. She told it to the little waitress, she told it to the cook, & the cook told me. This was the second or third evening after the event. I said nothing to any one until my Ma spoke to me of it, & asked "if I was not going to do something about it." I said "not until I deliberate." I feared to tell my husband of it at once; I dreaded the consequence. My Ma went several times to Mr. Vandevere, but obtained no satisfaction. I went to his house on the Monday evening after the occurrence. My Ma went with me, or preceded me. I asked Mr. Vandevere to speak with him. We went into the parlor, & there he confessed the act to me. And afterwards his wife came in, & he confessed it several times in her presence. I said several times to him before he confessed "you willian! unless you confess the truth my vengeance shall pursue you; & the mark of Cain shall rest upon you." And she appeared very much frightened. And I said also: "if I find my child has wronged you a mother's vengeance shall pursue her everlasting."

Miss Hannah Virginia Perrine was called & sworn.

Question by the Prosecutor.

Did you ever know of the accused Mr. Vanderveen, being guilty of acts similar to that here charged?

Answer.

I did.

Question by the Accused.

Did you ever hear Mrs. Doty say that she went to Mr. Vanderveen on the evening of his confession with a pistol in her pocket?

Answer.

I did.

Question by Session.

Name the similar acts of which you speak committed since Mr. Vanderveen became a member of the church?

Answer:

They were.

The Prosecutor here rested his case.

The Accused then called John S. Applegate who was sworn.

Question by Accused.

Relate the substance of what Dr. Doty said to you in reference to this matter?

Answer.

It was about this;—the Dr. said "I told Mr. Vanderveen that if he would confess to me, as he did to my wife, I would forgive him, & if ever any one charged it upon him he might appeal to me, & I would deny it, & say it was not so."

Mrs. Rachel M. Vanderveen was called & sworn.

Question by Accused:

Relate what you know concerning this matter.

Answer:

Mrs. Doty, Mrs. Bunker's Virginia came to my shop on the evening when they say this place to fit a Basement. Virginia was not out of the shop. The light was shining. Mr. Vanderveen was on the Platform at the shop door.

In a few days after Mrs. Bunker came & spoke of this subject. I said such a thing could not have taken place, there was no time nor opportunity for it. Mrs. Bunker on Saturday evening after—perhaps it was Monday—and said that Mrs. Doty was coming down.

The Rev. Doty came, & asked to see Mr. Vanderveer alone. They went into the parlor; presently Mrs. Bunker followed. Soon Mrs. Bunker called & called for me. I went in & heard Mrs. Doty demand of Mr. Vanderveer a confession: but he did not confess.

Question by Accused:

It is stated here that Mr. Vanderveer confessed in your presence; is that so?

Answer:

Never; there was no confession nor anything like it in my hearing.

Question by Accused:

State the dimensions of the Stoop or Platform.

Answer:

It is nearly two feet from the door to the fence; the whole about six feet long & three & a half feet wide; & there are two steps five or six inches deep.

Question by Prosecutor:

What did you say to Mrs. Bunker about this matter?

Answer:

I said to Mrs. Doty "that if she had come down quietly before Mrs. Bunker came this matter might have been settled if there had been anything in it."

Mr. Richard McDowell was called & sworn.

Question by Prosecutor:

Please state what I said to you about this matter.

Answer:

Dr. Doty stated to me that there was a difficulty between Mr. Vanderveer & himself; & that if Mr. Vanderveer would confess it before a third person, without stating what it was, he would forgive & forget the occurrence. And he might choose any one he pleased. Then I called on Mr. Vanderveer, & he said "I would like to know what Dr. Doty means; I have no confession to make." From Dr. Doty's statement I thought he had been cautious, & taken all necessary steps.

The parties then retired.

There after due deliberation the Session agreed to the following points:

1. That doubtless the propriety of admitting the testimony of the wives of the parties in any case, & inasmuch as in this case their testimony is directly conflicting in its essential point, all that part of the evidence must be thrown out.

solemnly denies such knowledge.
When the testimony was all taken
the defendant desired to make
a statement, which virtually
retracted the plea of "not guilty".
It was to this effect; that she did
notice the attentions of the married
man referred to towards her niece,
that she was grieved thereby, and
remonstrated with the parties
fearing scandal would arise.
That she is now only sorry that
she did not use stronger measures.
That she now sees the matter
in a different light. That
she had hitherto understood
the session as charging herself

with improprieties and hence her
denials. And as to her retaining
her niece in her family, the said
niece had repented, sincerely
as she believed, and last winter
was admitted into the Jamesburg
Church."

After due deliberation the u-
nanimous decision of the Session
was that the charge and speci-
fications are fully proven.
