## PREFACE.

The "Form of Government" of the Presbyterian Church, in Chapter IX, Section VIII, directs that "every Session shall keep a fair Record of its proceedings; which record shall be, at least once in every year, submitted to the inspection of the Presbytery."

Notwithstanding this direction, great want of neatness and precision is found in every section of the Church, in the method of keeping these records. There is also a great lack of uniformity in the size and kind of books in which they are inscribed.

It is with the desire of aiding to do away these evils, by presenting to the Church a model volume of Sessional Records, that the Board of Publication has, at the request of a number of Ministers, and of Presbyteries, prepared this book. It should be kept by a Clerk appointed by the Session, and the entries be made in a neat and legible hand; the necessity for interlineations and corrections being carefully avoided.

A CHURCH REGISTRY has likewise been prepared. As it is not required to be annually carried to Presbytery for inspection and approval, and as it may not be filled at the same time with the book of Minutes, it seems best that it should usually be a separate volume. Still, the two may be obtained bound together or apart.

### Specimen of Records.

For the benefit of inexperienced Clerks of Sessions, we present the following, which will exhibit the proper method of making entries, upon a number of the commonest matters to be recorded.

## MINUTES OF SESSION.

1859.  
Sept. 17th.

JOHNSVILLE, SEPT. 17, 1859.

The Session met at the Parsonage at 3 o'clock, P. M. Present, Rev. James S., the Moderator, with Elders John W., James S., and Thomas W. The meeting was opened with prayer. The minutes of the last meeting were read.

Robert S. and Mrs. Ellen F. (wife of David) appeared before Session and were examined on their religious experience, when, having made a satisfactory profession of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, they were admitted to the sealing ordinance of the Lord's Supper. J. K. and T. R., after due examination, were admitted to the sealing ordinances of Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

A free conversation was held upon the state of religion in the congregation, from which it appeared that there was much cause for gratitude and encouragement.

It having appeared that Common Fairs charges Henry A. with unchristian conduct in several particulars, the Moderator and Elder W. were appointed a Committee to wait upon Mr. A. upon the subject, and report to the Session at its next meeting.

Charles T. appeared before the Session and preferred certain charges against Samuel L. After hearing the charges, the Session directed its clerk to give the accused a copy of the same, with the names of the witnesses to support them, and to cite all concerned to appear at the next meeting of the July-Session.

Elder John W. was appointed to attend the approaching meeting of the Presbytery.

With regard to the first exception the  
minutes of Session contain a sufficient  
answer. There it is distinctly stated that  
the parties were beyond our reach, and  
since efforts to reclaim them "were im-  
practicable." The error was not that no  
such efforts had been made. The respect-  
fully suggest that the objection would have  
been better taken if it had been to the  
effect that the Session should have sus-  
pended those members while beyond their  
reach, and then should have waited till  
process could reach them. But even  
then we believe that to require a Session  
to wait indefinitely is to keep the letter at  
the expense of the spirit of the law.

Answer to  
Exceptions.

The second exception seems to us to  
be contradictory of the first. In this case  
the Session only suspended, and the min-  
utes contain abundant evidence of "effort  
to reclaim," before suspension. And so if  
the first objection is well founded the  
second cannot be. The word "farcical"  
as applied to regular proceedings in these  
cases is unfortunate, and we cannot defend  
it. And we must acknowledge that  
the minute concerning the suspension  
is not full. The facts were that after  
many & patient efforts to reclaim; and  
after the parties had fully acknowledged  
their faults to Committees of Session, and

We would especially warn those professing Christianity that resorting to such places is injurious to themselves, and to the cause of Christ; and such conduct cannot be persisted in without very seriously affecting their standing in this Church.

"The Session of the First Church of Oranbury, most respectfully, represent to the Presbytery of Monmouth that the assessments that are laid upon the churches have greatly increased within a few years past, and, what is more objectionable, are rapidly coming to assume the right to assess a tax upon the churches. And this increasing burden is giving us, so far as the General Assembly is concerned, a body less and less efficient and satisfactory as a court of last resort. We have waited and paid in silence, under the hope, if not the promise, of such a reduction of the General Assembly as would make it less expensive and more efficient. Therefore it seems plain to your petitioners that it is high time for the Presbytery to endeavor to find some practical method of at once relieving our burdens and reducing the Assembly. And for this purpose this Session do hereby respectfully, but urgently, petition the Presbytery to fall back upon their constitutional right, and upon the ancient custom:—the right of declining to send to the Assembly the whole number of Commissioners to which we are entitled; and the ancient custom of providing for the expenses of our own Commissioners. And we press this matter the more urgently,

## Books of Record.

- 72.—The Presbytery urgently recommends that Sessions procure
- (1st).—The Book for Sessional Records prepared by the Board of Publication, which shall have the name of the church put distinctly on the cover.
  - (2nd).—The Church Register, prepared by the same Board, in which shall be kept a full record of Pastors, Elders, Deacons, Communicants, Baptisms, Marriages and Deaths.
  - (3rd).—A separate blank book for the Records of all Congregational Meetings and important items of Church History.

## Rules for Church Sessions.

- 73.—The Stated Clerk shall keep a correct list of the names of the Ruling Elders comprising the Sessions of the several Churches of Presbytery, and to aid in this the roll of churches shall be called at each Fall Meeting to learn if any changes have occurred by death or otherwise.
- 74.—When a change in the membership of any Session occurs by death or otherwise, the Clerk of such Session is required immediately to report the change, in writing, to the Stated Clerk of Presbytery.
- 75.—Churches not represented by a Ruling Elder at any Stated Meeting of Presbytery shall be required to give reasons therefor.
- 76.—Church Sessions are required to forward to the Committee appointed to prepare Narratives for Synod and General Assembly, a written Narrative of the State of Religion within their bounds, at least two weeks before the Spring Stated Meeting of Presbytery, and any additional important facts occurring before the Fall Stated Meeting shall be reported to the same Committee.
- 77.—Ruling Elders must be duly elected by the Sessions in order to be entitled to a seat in Presbytery, except when a church possesses but one Ruling Elder.
- 78.—Church Sessions shall be required to review their rolls at suitable intervals and to purge them of the names of such members as have been absent for a long time, or whose residence is not known; and such names shall not be reported to the General Assembly; at the same time a separate list of such names shall be kept to be used as may be judged expedient in case these persons should at some subsequent time make their appearance. (See Assembly's Digest, page 52.)
- 79.—The Sessions of the churches are required to defray the expenses of their delegates to Presbyterial and Synodical Meetings.
- 80.—Sessional Records of Churches shall be submitted for review at the Stated Meeting in April; and churches then delinquent shall present their books at the next Stated Meeting.
- 81.—At the close of each year (April 1st) a full Statistical Report of the Church shall be sent to the Presbytery and also embodied in the records of Sessions.

## Rules for Keeping Records of Sessions.

- 82.—Avoid erasure, interlineations and foot-notes. Insert on the Records no written or printed matter on separate slips of paper.
- 83.—Record the date, time and place of the meetings; the names of the Moderator and Elders present at every meeting; and the names of the absentees.
- 84.—Record the opening and closing of each meeting with prayer, and the reading and approval of the minutes of the last meeting.
- 85.—Record nothing which is not vital to the transactions of the meeting, such as plans, suggestions, discussions, motions that are lost, except by special order of the Session; of which order the Record should take notice.
- 86.—Record the Administration of the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper at the next Regular Meeting succeeding.
- 87.—Record the full name of applicants for church membership; in case of married females, the maiden name, and wife or widow; in case of minors, son or daughter of; and in every case, whether baptized.
- 88.—Record the full title of the church, to which a certificate of dismission is granted, the date of the certificate and the full name of the person dismissed.
- 89.—In case of discipline, record every step in the process, as provided by the Book of Discipline. Carefully record the testimony given by the respective witnesses.
- 90.—When the previous action of the Session appears in the Record, the page, or pages, on which it is recorded should be distinctly noted.
- 91.—Record the name of the Elder appointed as delegate to the meetings of the Presbytery and Synod, and also a report of his attendance.
- 92.—The Record of each meeting is to be duly attended by the Clerk or Moderator.
- 93.—The Clerk of each Session is directed to fasten, neatly and securely, a copy of these rules in the Book of Sessional Records.
