MINUTES OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1812-1909

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Cranbury, Feby 12, 1812 at a large & respectable
Meeting of the first Presbyterian Congregation of
Cranbury for the purpose of taking into Considera-
tion the propriety of Raising the Salary of the
Rev'd Geo: J Woodhull and for Choosing New
Trustees &c. Notice having been given from the
but just two Sundays of Interdict Meeting.

The Meeting Proceeded to the Choice of a
Moderator and Clerk when Nath^r Hunt Esq.
was chosen Moderator and Andrew M^r Dowell
was Chosen Clerk it was then moved that the sum
of One Hundred Dollars be Raised in P Congregation
in addition to the present Salary to be paid to the
aforesaid George J Woodhull yearly while he continu-
eth pastor of said Congregation the same was
unanimously agreed to the time of the addition
of Salary to commence on the first of May 1812.
This Motion was then put by the Moderator
whether the aforesaid sum of one hundred dollars
should be laid on the Tots or Raised by super-
scription it was Carried in the favour of the latter.
The Meeting then proceeded to the Choice of Trustees
William Nathaniel Hunt Esq David Chambers
Emo Baldwin Jr^r Day and Andrew M^r Dowell
was Re-elected and Dr^r Kerr and Dr^r Davidson
were Elected New Members in the Room of Dr^r Miles
Berkley and Dr^r Embley they having Declined
to stand.

May 29th 1813 the first Presbyterian Congregation of
Cranbury having met in the Church for the purpose
of choosing New Trustees and to discuss their plan to
Raise the Salaries of Calling the Pastor by subscrip-
tion having failed Previous Notice having been
given from the Pulpit the Congregation Proceeded
to the Choice of a Moderator when Nath^r Hunt
was chosen & Andrew M^r Dowell Chosen Clerk for
said Meeting there went into the Choice of
Trustees Nath^r Hunt Esq declined Standing
as one of the Trustees Joseph M^r Cherry and
Abraham Boyer was Nominated in his Room it
was decided in favour of Abraham Boyer Apple
M^r Cherry Esq was named in the Room of Col^r
David Chambers in having declined there being
no Objections he was Elected one of the Trustees
Emo Baldwin was Re-elected and also Andrew
M^r Dowell Dr^r Day Dr^r Davidson and Dr^r John
Kerr as Trustees — the former were all
overruled by the last three
A Motion was made & agreed to by the
Congregation for a Clerk to the Board of Trustees
to attend their Meetings and to Enter the Minutes
and to draw Collection lists and to do such
other Business as may be necessary and for his
service to receive a Compensation such as the
Board may think Just for his services Dr^r John
Spencer was Elected Clerk to the above
Business. A Motion was made & seconded the
adoption of Salary of \$100 per Rained on the Pastors
the same was Carried Generally in favour of the
Motion it was then moved and Seconded that
the sum of twenty four Cents be laid on each Lot
whether the Pastor be called or not on each Lot
Pence and that the sum of twenty Cents be
laid on all the Presidencies of Lots in the Church
the Meeting then broke up without Doing
any other Business

Nov^r 19th 1813 the Trustees Met at the House
of Peter Holman agreeable to Notice from the

Cave House with straw and to draw up over
the Treasurer for the Amount out of the money
Raised for Repairs, The Trustees adjourned till
next Day —

The Trustees proceeded to Examine the Receipts of
the Rev. George J Woodhull as Received from the
Treasurer from May the 15th 1811 until February
the 35th 1814 and we find that there has been paid
the sum of One Thousand four hundred & Seventy five
Dollars and three Cents.

And we find by Examining the Min-
utes that there has been no final Settlement with
the aforesaid George J Woodhull since the twentieth day
of April Eighteen Hundred and Eleven and by the
said Settlement the Congregation had paid the said
Woodhull so much up to the first of November eighteen
Hundred and Ten — The Salary of Mr. Woodhull from
November 1810 until November 1813 being three years
Eighteen Months at \$100 Per Year is \$600.00 and
Eighteen Months at \$600.00 Per year is \$750 —

and we find by the present Statement 1475.3
that he is paid up until the first of \$125.3
November Eighteen Hundred & Thirteen with a
Balance in favour of the Congregation of one
Hundred and Twenty five Dollars and three Cents

Mr. Baldwin —

Mr Baldwin Presented an Account from Charles South for Timber furnished for the Garden fence on the Parsonage to the Amount of \$27.04 Cent the Trustees Order that the said Account be allowed and the Treasurer pay the same out of any Money in his hands Raised for that Purpose and settle the same with the Board on Settlement.

And we proceeded to Make a general Settlement with the Treasurer up to the Present date, and we find in his hands Thirty four Dollars and Sixty seven Cents over and above of the Balance Paid the Rev George S Woodhull of \$125.03 Cents

The Trustees agree to allow William Schenck for his Services as Clerk Two Dollars and Ninety cents for one year Abraham Bigelow Presented an Account to the amount of Three Dollars for Posts and Casting for the Garden fence on the Parsonage the Treasurer is Ordered to pay the same out of any money in his hands Raised for that Purpose

Nathaniel Hunt Esq Presented an Account to the amount of \$55:49 Cents as Money he has paid out for the Congregation while he was Treasurer of the same the Trustees Order Mr. Smedick the Treasurer to pay the above sum out of any Money in his hands belonging to the Congregation

Trustees appointed Joseph M Cheney & John Davidson a Committee to make out the Collection List with the Clerk as soon as the Lists from the Collectors can be obtained

April 18 1814 the Congregation being called for the purpose of having Trustees of no Corporation the Rev Mr Woodhull Nominate Charles Lark of no settled abode in the following Towns or where he goes John J. Dowdell in the name of Andrew J. Dowdell alias Jacob D. Dowdell in some of England Daniel Johnson Esq York Yorkton and Abraham Brewster of Boston formerly the Treasurer a witness to Charles Lark for his having given when of late his money that now belongs to him during year as the Clerk of the Tabernacle & of the Books of no Corporation

April 18-1815 the Trustees met at the House of Peter Gilman to agreeable notice from the Subject for the Purpose of settling with the Rev George S Woodhull - - - - -

The Trustees went into business proceeded to examine the Receipts of the Rev George S Woodhull amounting from the beginning of April the 20 of March 1814 till March 3-1815 the sum of One hundred and fifty five Dollars & eighty cents together with a Balance due from the P. J. S. Woodhull to the Congregation on the Settlement of April 19-1814 of one hundred and Twenty five Dollars & three Cents making

Of Five Hundred & Eighty Dollars & Eighty three Cents
And was find by the present Statement that he left
Died up Until the first of November 1814 with a balance
In favor of the Congregation of Eighty Dollars & Eighty
three Cents —

June 17th 1815 the Trustees met at the house of
Peter Wilmett agreeable to Notice given from the pulpit
for the purpose of settling the accounts of Repairs done on
the Parsonage

The Trustees proceeded to

Cents be Received by the Treasurers, which leaves a Balance
of Thirty four Dollars Sixty Eight Cents unpaid —

The Trustees then proceeded, and made a final Settlement
With the Treasurer up to the twelfth of April 1815 —

The Congregation previous to Electing Trustees proceed
to the choice of a President, Moderator & Clerk, when
John Day Esq. was chosen President, John Herr, Moderator
& John T. M'Dowell Clerk.

It was represented by the Moderator that there remained
Thirty four Dollars & Sixty Eight Cents of the Charges
of the Repairs done on the parsonage unpaid. And that
some deposit might be desired to raise the same,
It was agreed to raise it by subscription.

The Meeting then proceeded to the choice of Trustees
for the ensuing year, as has been noticed before, adjourned

The trustees proposed to the house of Peter Wilmett
Whence Mr. J. Gulick being duly sworn,

Proceeded and made a final Settlement with the
treasurer, to the twelfth of April - 1815 as has been
Noticed, made choice of John Day Esq. President
& Mr. J. Gulick Clerk for the ensuing year — Adjourned

November 26 — 1815

And That he shall perform the full Duties of a sexton
such as Keeping the Church clean, Ring the Bell, build fires
in the Stoves &c. Keep no尸in the Graveyard, Charge no
more than two Dollars for Burial full Crown Profane
Graves, and One Dollar for Cuttings, and leave the Prospects
to the Good Repose. As it now is, Natural Decay & the like
excepted.

Catharine Hart Esq. A Note of hand from the P. Reuben Vandebcke
In favor of the congregation for ten Dollars with Interest
and Judgment Contra heretofore.

And we also find that the last years Rent of the P. Reuben
Vandebcke Ending on the first Day of March eighteen
hundred & one thousand, of Fifteen Dollars remaine also
Unpaid

Then proceeded to examine the Contract made with Richard Valentine
on the first Day of March Ultmo. by three of the trustees authority for
that business agreed thereto. That the P. Richard Valentine Shall
do the Duty of a sexton for whose service he is to have
the use of the grave yard and the several gardens thereto
appertaining and a Sodmack of the Garden Acre between
the Doctor Edwards & the Meeting house, with Three Dollars
in Cents to be paid between this and the first of April following
at which time the Contract ends - Agreed

And likewise that Mr. Carpenter Wilson has Rented the
lowest part of the house wherein Mrs. Vandebcke now lives
belonging to the congregation, for which she is to pay to the
Trutlers either of Eleven Dollars On or before the first Day
of April next Ensuing the Agreement being Concluded
for one year - Agreed

The Trutlers Next proceeded to examine the Receipts
of the Reverend George J. Woodhull from April the
Thirteenth Eighteen hundred & Sixteen to April the
Sixteenth Eighteen hundred & Seventeen. And we find by
those Receipts, that the Salary is settled up to the
first of November eighteen hundred & sixteen

And that those remaine with the Congregation from Mr.

George S. Woodhull, One Hundred and Thirty three Dollars

& Twenty two Cents at the present Date April 16 A.D. 1817

In the Treasurer's hands Thirty five Dollars & Sixty five

The Trustees Proceeded to the Church and after stating the reasons why this was not a stalemate of the funds and acpt they made choice of Richard Reid for Moderator and Peter C Bergen Clerk

The Congregation returned and the Trustees returned to St Headley and Received monies of other Collectors and excepted on their lists for it. the Board agreed to meet on next Friday to be published from the pulpit for the purpose of taking the necessary qualification Required by Lane Adjourned so

June 2 1821 the Board of Trustees met and after being sworn into Office they proceeded to the choice of a President and Secretary when Richard Reid was chosen President and Peter C Bergen Secretary —

The Board made a settlement with John Davison Treasurer and find remaining in his hands \$104.87

Resolved that Abram Bergen Aaron Lane and John Davison be a Committee to settle with Andrew Rowne late Collector of Salary and make report to the board at their next meeting

Resolved that Peter C Bergen be appointed to provide Materials for the painting the Parsonage House employ workmen to complete the painting and superintend the work and to draw from the Treasurer any monies not otherwise appropriated for the purpose

Resolved that the Congregation have Notice to meet on the forth Saturday in June to take in Consideration whether they shall be seats prepared in the gallery for the Chalk Singers or not Signed by order of the Board

My Dear Sir:-

The question upon which you ask my opinion is based as I understand it on the following facts.

The First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury has a fund derived from the voluntary contributions of its members which it desires to invest and the income from which is to be applied to the support of the Church. You know wish to know whether this fund is taxable.

Our Revised Statute page 1152 Sec. 2 * exempts from taxation the ~~endowment~~ buildings erected and used for religious worship and lands whereon the same are situated necessary to the fair use and enjoyment thereof not to exceed five acres for each ~~the~~ the furniture thereof and personal property used therein, and the endowment or fund of any religious Society. This language is to be construed strictly. Thus it is held that the parsonage although erected on the church lot is not exempt from taxation.

First Reformed Church vs. Lyon, 3 Wr. 360

Church of the Redeemer vs. Axtell, 12 Wr. 117. It is held that lands held by Trustees for the church situated apart from the church edifice do not constitute a part of the endowment or fund of the religious Society and are not exempt from taxation.

These decisions however seem based upon the idea that the statute does not contemplate the exemption of any real property other than the Church building itself and the lot not exceeding five acres on which it stands. The moneys which you have seem to me to be clearly within exemption which applies to the endowment or fund of any religious society, and my opinion is that it is exempt from taxation.
