The congregation of the Second Presbytery Church of Cranbury N.J. met in the Church in response to notice duly given E. D. Baskley was elected chairman and Geo. D. Mackay Secretary. Minutes of meeting held Apr. 24-1919 read and a motion approved. Mr. H. St. Crocker stated that at an informal meeting of the officers of the Church held a few weeks previous it was recommended by the officers that the Pastor

be increased and to make a motion the
commencing with April 1920 the pastor salary
be at the rate of \$2,600.00 per year, this motion was
dearly seconded by E. W. Walker and after a few formal
remarks it was unanimously carried.
The following persons were re-elected trustees for the
term of three years Isaac B. Brown, J. J. Brown, Ed
Stultz. A very complete report was submitted
by the pastor reviewing the work which he had been set
to do. In his absence the report was read by the Treasurer
W. L. Brown the treasurer made a report of the
receipts and disbursements during the past year which
showed the financial affairs of the church to be in
excellent shape. The report of the sexton and
Singer was read and it was found that the sexton
had been very helpful in many branches of the church
work. On motion all report were approved and the
Treasurer's report was directed to be printed and
distributed to the hands. The committee appointed
to investigate and report on the departure of Mr. Brown
perfectly and his future support states as follows
Whereas at an informal meeting of the officers
of this church to consider the policy of the church
in regard to its benevolence the undersigned were
appointed a committee to recommend a policy for
future guidance, your committee recommend
that the benevolence be distributed in
conjunction with such other agencies as are available for the
necessary maintenance of its beneficiaries
Second that in all cases where other aid is
available it shall be used made to conserve the funds
of the church for the propagation of the Gospel and the
maintenance of the essential agencies of the church
Third that the action of the Board of Officers in
crediting \$522.00 from Mr. Brown, to be used if
necessary for the purpose of placing him in a home
or for his funeral expenses and the present method
of his maintenance be approved and continued for
the ensuing year. The Board committee find
no investigation that at the present time has
been advised a amount of Mr. Brown \$935.00

Respectfully submitted, Bro. W. L. Brown, D. D. A. A. G. P.,
W. L. Brown, Committee. A vote of thanks was extended
in thanks to the donors for making a loan of the debt
of the church. The various items making up the
budget for the ensuing year was read after some
discussion the sum of \$3,300.00 was adopted as a budget

After some further business relating the the affairs of the Church, On Motion adjourned.

The Annual meeting of the Congregation, was held as above at 8 P. M. Mr. C. C. Groves, President of the Board of Trustees read the call for the meeting, and stated the first business would be the election of a Chairman. On motion, duly recorded and carried, Mr. C. D. Barclay was elected Chairman. Mr. Barclay took the Chair and expressed his thanks to the meeting for the honor. He then called for nominations for a Secretary. On motion, duly recorded and carried Mrs. F. Scheuchter was elected Secretary, and accepted office.

The minutes of the Annual meeting of April 8, 1921, were then read and approved.

The Chairman called for a report from the Committee on Church Shanty, appointed at the last meeting. Mrs. Cora Gordon, Chairman, reported that the shanty had been purchased and set out. On motion a vote of thanks was extended to the Committee for its work. S. & C.

The terms of the following Trustees expired April 1st, 1921 - Messrs. Henry Conover, Tom Rogers, and Wm. H. Gordon. On motion, S. & C. they were re-elected for a term of three years.

The Treasurer of the Congregation, Mr. Charles C. Groves, then read his report - showing a balance at the close of the Church year - April 1-1921 of \$1,156.31 - Reports were also read from the following organizations - Women's Foreign Missionary Society, Sec. & Treas. - Women's Home Missionary Society, Sec. & Treas. - Sunday School, Secy. & Treas. - Senior Christian Endeavor, Sec. & Treas. - Junior C. E. Secy. & Treas. - Sketch & Chatter, Sec. & Treas. - Cemetery Committee, Treas. - Home Dept. Sec. & Treas. - Men's Bible Class, Treas. - Men's Brotherhood, Sec. & Treas. - Benevolent Fund, Treas. - General Report from the General Assembly. The Pastor

then entered the room and read his Annual Report and also a report on the conditions of the Cemetery. On motion, S. & C., all reports were accepted and ordered filed.

The report on the conditions of the Cemetery as presented by the Pastor was then discussed, and a set of resolutions offered by the Pastor were then taken into consideration. On motion, by a separate vote, taken in each case, these six resolutions were unanimously adopted, as follows: -

RESOLUTIONS IN REFERENCE TO THE CEMETERY.

1. The Second Presbyterian Congregation hereby delegates entire charge of its cemetery to a committee consisting of 5 members two of whom are to be ladies. This committee shall be appointed by the congregation and announced within the next two weeks. All the necessary authority to carry out the following directions is hereby conveyed to said committee which is to make a detailed annual report to the congregation every year. The committee is to select its own chairman and secretary and keep a record of all its transactions in a separate book. It shall conduct all its affairs in a business like manner and issue deeds to lots when paid for.
2. The committee shall place all the funds connected with the cemetery in the hands of the treasurer of the congregation. The committee shall see that all lot owners are encouraged to provide an endowment for the perpetual care of their lots which endowment shall be promptly invested to the best advantage compatible with good security. Only the income from year to year from such endowments shall be expended.
3. The congregation directs the committee to designate a caretaker for the cemetery who shall be employed by the committee at a stated salary for a definite term. Said caretaker is to work only under the direction of the committee and shall be the only person permitted to engage in any kind of work in the cemetery. The committee will make the charges for the services of the caretaker and place them in the common treasury. Under no circumstances shall the caretaker engage in any work outside the cemetery other than that assigned by the committee nor receive pay for any such work except from the committee.
4. The committee is directed to prepare a plan for the care of as many lots as possible either by endowment or by annual charges and communicate such plan to all the lot owners with a view to enlisting their financial support in the improvement of the whole cemetery. The committee is directed to promote this side of its plans with the utmost diligence.
5. The congregation directs the committee to make a plan of the cemetery and mark off the boundaries of as many lots as is possible, such a plan together with the numbers and location of the lots and the record of the deeds shall be made a matter of permanent record.
6. The committee is directed and authorized to make any rules necessary for the welfare of the cemetery and to devise a plan of caring for all lots the owners of which cannot be located after diligent search.

The Pastor then retired.

On motion, it was resolved that the number of members on the Cemetery Committee be five (5), three gentlemen and two ladies. On motion, Section 1 was amended to read - "a Committee consisting of 5 members, two of whom are to be ladies, to serve for the term of one year." Seconded and unanimously carried.

On motion, Section 2 was amended to read - "The Committee shall place all funds connected with the Cemetery in the hands of the Treasurer of the Cemetery Committee," etc. - E. & C.

On motion, the recommendation of the Session, as stated by the Pastor in his report, with reference to free pews was discussed, and it was resolved that hereafter no pew in this Church shall be considered rented to anyone.

The recommendation of the Session as to the desirability of electing four more elders was discussed. On motion it was resolved to elect four more elders to serve the Church and it was suggested that the election be held on Sunday, April 30th, immediately after morning worship.

The President of the Board of Trustees spoke of connecting the Church with the water system. This matter was referred to the Board for action.

The Chairman then spoke of the splendid reports presented by the various organizations and stated he thought it was a cause for great rejoicing, and that all the members had work to do to keep up to the standard and to go forward. He also spoke of the splendid balance reported by the Church Treasurer - that there was no debt on the Church property, that the Budget had been oversubscribed. He congratulated the new members on their good work in the financial line - and the Ditchers Club and Men's Brotherhood on the fine social work carried on by these societies. He stated that the spirit of harmony among all societies speaks well for the Church. He spoke of the number of people who might be

added to the Church this year, and suggested the forming of a "Set-one Club" - that is that each member - or at least one hundred of our members pledge themselves to get one new member this year. No action was taken on this suggestion.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned to meet immediately after morning worship on Sunday, April 30, 1922 for the election of four new elders.

Brooklyn N.Y. April 30 - 1922

The adjourned meeting of the Board of Trustees of Brooklyn met in the Church after the morning service for adjournment of annual meeting held April 21st and also in response to notice read for first time Sunday morning calling for a congregational meeting to be held Sunday April 30, 1922 for the purpose of electing additional elders as adopted at the annual meeting of Brooklyn held April 21st. The pastor has furnished elaborate notices and order and clerk of Session has made an excellent secretary.

The moderator stated that there had been some doubt expressed as to whether the meeting for the election of elders was called in proper manner as the Session had not made the call and fixed date of meeting. He also stated that it was for the congregation to decide whether to go on with the election or defer action for the present. He gave opportunity for any one to state their objections to holding the election. The moderator stated that in the matter of the election of additional elders he had recommended by the Session to the congregation and the congregation had voted to elect four additional elders and in his report he had suggested that the election be held after the service on April 30th notice of same having been given from the pulpit last Sunday. He was of the opinion that a proper notice of the meeting had been given. He urged anyone having objections to the election to be held at this time to state their objections. No objections were made. Mr. Henryson on one stated that he felt the Session had recommended the election of four additional elders, he felt that the order of

the fact that news had soon leaked it might be well to let only one
and have a motion that it be reconsidered in order to elect four
additional elders and only elect one at this time. The motion was
dearly seconded by John Major. The question was then for discussion
and David stated that although it would be your plan to elect
only one at this time after some further work the question was passed
it was unanimously voted to elect only one elder. Elders James and
John were presented to the election of an elder the motion was de-
arly seconded by David & David and unanimously carried.
Nominations being called for C. W. Walker nominated Henry Reed
the nomination was dearly seconded by John Major. Other nominations
were called for but were not made. David & David moved that
the nomination be closed same was dearly carried. The Moderator
stated that the election was dearly called but of the congregation saw
for the same matter the deal to cast the ballot. On motion of a 23rd the
election was postponed to cast the ballot. The Moderator reported that he
had carried the case from Henry Reed. The Moderator declared Mr Reed
elected to the office of ruling elder at this church. The Moderator stated
that he understood that some other matters were coming before the meeting
and he thought he had better retire. On motion Mr H. L. Loomer
was elected to preside for the remainder of the meeting.

Mr Loomer stated that he understood that Mr. Brown a member
of the Board of Trustees had some matters to bring before the meeting and
he was given a opportunity to present same. Mr Brown stated that
at a special meeting of all the officers of the church held last
Sunday afternoon the officers had unanimously voted to
recommenced to the congregation that the present salary
be increased to \$300. per year. On motion was unanimously
voted to approve the recommendation of the officers and
increase the present salary to \$300. per year. Mr Brown also
stated that the budget through an oversight had not been
