Second, Presbyterian Church,
in the
Village of Cranberry N. J.

A number of the members of the first Presbyterian Church in Cranberry, finding themselves unable to obtain adequate rooms for their assembling to worship in their old Church, and having endeavored in vain to obtain either an enlargement of that edifice, or the erection of a new, and more spacious one; - thought it their duty to withdraw and erect anew a house of worship for themselves and such others as might unite with them. Accordingly in the latter end of 1837, they commenced a new building, which was finished in the month of June following, and was dedicated to Almighty God on the 26th. day of June 1838. - The said number also, by a delegate duly appointed for that purpose, applied to the Presbytery of New Brunswick, to take measures for organizing them into a new Church. - The Presbytery having had this report before them, proceeded to sit, pursuant to a call, on the 19th. day of June 1838, in conformity with their request, a report was read by Samuel C. Miller D. D. Professor in the Theological Seminary, at Princeton, and the Rev. David Comfort, Pastor of the Church in Kingston, a Committee to attend as soon as convenient and organize a second Church in Cranberry. According to the said Committee attended at Cranberry, on the 28th. day of June 1838, to give notice of their organization.

Of the above named members, their testimonials set forth, that Aaron Lane, Jacob Inouiche, & Elias Day were Ruling Elders, in good standing in the Church from which they were dismissed.

✓ Margaret Inouiche (late the widow Covert's) wife of Isaac C. Inouiche & Mahalah Cornell & Victoria H. Cornell, her Daughters, also pronounced certificates of membership in the Church of New Brunswick and of regular dismission therefrom in good standing.

These 32 members solemnly agreed to walk together as a Church of Christ, and to be called and known by the name of the Second Presbyterian Church in Cranbury.

Mr. Aaron Lane, Mr. Jacob Inouiche, Mr. Elias Day, were then asked whether they would continue to serve the Church as Ruling Elders in the name and the number of the Church, was asked whether they were willing to acknowledge and receive their brethren as their spiritual Fathers; and both parties having answered these questions respectively in the affirmative, these three brethren, who solemnly installed and pronounced Ruling Elders in this Church; and the transaction was closed with prayer.

At the close of the installation service, Isaac C. Inouiche, Dominicus Marshon, and John Covert were nominated to the Church, as candidates for the office of Ruling Elders. - This nomination was reported from the pulpit on three successive Sabbaths and no objection having been made, they were regularly ordained to that office on the 22d day of July, 1838.

July 29th 1838. - The Synod met, being called together from the pulpit at the Common, Town with prayer, present all the Elders. - The Rev. Dr. Miller presiding. - Mr. Isaac C. Inouiche was nominated to attend the Presbytery, appointed to encamp at New Brunswick on the 7th day of August next. - Congregationalists present.

Sabbath, September 5th 1838. - The Synod met present all the Elders, viz. Mr. Aaron Lane, Jacob Inouiche, Elias Day, Isaac C. Inouiche, Dominicus Marshon, & John Covert. - The Rev. Dr. Samuel Miller, D. D. being present, presided. - Began with prayer.
