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*Session Record,
of the
Second, Presbyterian Church,
in the
Village of Cranberry N.J.*

A number of the members of the first Presbyterian Church in Cranberry, finding themselves unable to obtain adequate room for their families to worship in their old church, and having endeavored in vain to obtain either an enlargement of that edifice, or the erection of a new and more spacious one; - thought it their duty to withdraw and erect a new house of worship for themselves and such others as might unite with them. Accordingly, in the autumn of 1837, they commenced a new building, which was finished in the month of June following, and was dedicated to Almighty God on the 26th day of June 1838. - The said members also, by a delegate duly appointed for that purpose, applied to the Presbytery of New Brunswick, to take measures for organizing them into a new church. - The Presbytery having had the subject before them, agreed to be present at meeting, due on the 19th day of June 1838, in conformity with their request, appoint the Rev. Samuel Miller D. D. Professor in the Theological Seminary at Princeton, and the Rev. " David Confort, Pastor of the Church in Livingston, a Committee to attend as soon as convenient and organize a second church in Cranberry. According to the said Committee attended at length agreeably to due notice given on the 28th day of

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1838, and performed the service for which they were appointed; A Sermon was preached by Dr. Miller June 21st. & 23d. - after sermon, testimonial of membership and dismission from the First Church in Cranberry, was pronounced in favour of the following persons, viz.

of the above named Members their testimonials set forth, that Aaron Lane, Jacob Smidtke, & Eliza Day were Ruling Elders, in good standing in the Church from which they were dismissed. -

Margaret Smidtke late the widow Everett, wife of Isaac G. Smidtke & Mahala Everett & Natural C. Everett, his daughter, also produced certificates of membership in the Church of New Brunswick and of regular dismission therefrom in good standing. -

These 32 members solemnly agreed to congregate as a Church of Christ, and to be called and known by the name of the Second Presbyterian Church in Cranberry. -

Mr. Aaron Lane, Mr. Jacob Smidtke & Mr. Eliza Day, were then asked whether they were willing to serve this Church as Ruling Elders in the same and the members of the Church were asked whether they were willing to acknowledge and receive them both as their spiritual Fathers; and both being having answered these questions respectively in the affirmative, these three brethren were so admitted and pronounced Ruling Elders in this Church; and the transaction was closed with prayer. -

At the close of the installation service, Isaac G. Smidtke, Dominick Meeker, and John Covert were nominated to the Church as candidates for the office of Ruling Elder. - This nomination was repeated from the Pulpit on three successive Sabbath's, and no objection having been made, they were duly ordained to that office on the 22d. day of July, 1838. -

July 29th, 1838. - The session met, being called to the Pulpit after dinner, began with prayer, present all the Elders, - The Rev. Dr. Miller, reading. - Mr. Jacob Smidtke was nominated to attend the Presbytery, appointed to concern at New Brunswick on the 10th day of August next. - concluded with prayer. -

Sabbath, October 30th, 1838. The session met present all the Elders, viz. Aaron Lane, Jacob Smidtke, Eliza Day, Isaac G. Smidtke, Dominick Mershon, John Covert; - The Rev. Samuel Miller, D.D. being present, presided. - Began with prayer. The following persons applied to be received into this Church as Certificate, and unanimous by admission, viz.



I. Members, Column 1-8:

Additions, Column 1-3. In the addition to church membership, distinguish between those by Profession, those by Reaffirmation (Formerly Communion), Chapter VI, Section VI, as amended in 1927, those by Certificate, and those by Restoration. Additions by Profession and by Reaffirmation are to be added and the total placed in Column 1. The column headed "Restored" is to include all those who have been reinstated, whether from the Suspended Roll, or by action of Session after full judicial process.

Losses, Column 4-6. In the losses, distinguishing between those discontinued, those placed upon the Suspended Roll, and those deceased. "Dissolved," is to include the members dismissed to other churches, also those erased from the roll under Sections 2 and 3 of the Discipline. Dissolved and also those excommunicated. The column headed "Suspended Roll" is to include the number of non-resident members whose names were placed upon, during the year, by the Session under Sections 50 and 51, Book of Discipline, also those suspended after full judicial process.

"Net Total of Communicants" Column 7. This net total of communicants should include both "resident" and "non-resident" members. See Book of Discipline, Chapter VI, Section 60. Be sure to compare your report of communicants with that of the previous year and adjust the return so that it will balance with the "Total members previous year, 205." Additions, "Profession plus Reaffirmation" 22, "Certificate" 16, "Restored" 1, "Total 43. "Dissolved" 12, "Suspended Roll" 8, "Dissolved" 6, total 36. Gain, 7. Net total 191.

Sabbath and Missionary Work, Column 8. To include officers, teachers and scholars in all Sabbath schools connected with the congregation, but not in the "Sabbath School Roll" nor the "Home Department." (Note.—A separate statement of the details of Sabbath-school work is to be made for the use of the Board of Christian Education, blanks for which will be furnished by the Board.)

Communions, Column 9-11.

Count the fractions of the dollars in all columns.

General Assembly etc., Column 9. To include all monies given for the ordinary expenses of your Presbytery, your Synod and the General Assembly.

Current Receipts, Column 10. To include all monies received from all sources for the ordinary expenses of the local church, except monies received as mission aid from any mission board or agency, or from another particular church.

Special Receipts, Column 11. To include all monies received for special local church purposes, as extraordinary repairs, building funds, endowment funds, etc. Income or principal of endowment funds used for current expenses are to be included in Column 10.

III. Benevolences, Column 12:

Count the fractions of the dollars in this column which have been paid to any benevolent cause.

All monies are to be included in this column which have been paid to the totality of all monies contributed to:

1. *National Missions*.—To include all monies paid to the Board of National Missions or to any of its divisions or departments including all colored People; Mission objects; the contributions of Women's and other Missionary Societies; our Missions to Colored People; Foreign School Missionary Work; Evangelism in the Church at large or under Synodical or Presbytery auspices; Church Extension Work under the direction of the Board; City, Immigrant and Industrial Work; Army and Navy Chaplaincy and their work. Also all monies paid for Presbyterian and Synodical Home Missions and Church Extension.

2. *Foreign Missions*.—To include all monies paid for the spread of the Gospel in foreign lands, whether given through the Board directly or again through one of its agencies or to institutions under the direction of the Board, including contributions of Women's European Continent through the Board of Foreign Missions.

3. *Christian Education*.—To include all contributions, whether sent to the Board or direct to colleges, seminaries, and schools with which the Board is authorized to co-operate; to student pastors' work at state universities; to theological and normal schools; and for the education of candidates for the ministry and of colored and colored students. Contributions to institutions connected with Foreign Missions and for Sabbath Observance. Also all monies contributed to its Department of Stewardship.

4. *Relief Fund*.—We include all monies paid to the Relief Department of the Board of Foreign Missions, otherwise included in the contributions of societies, etc. Please make sure that monies paid on account of the seven and one-half percent deduction of a church that its pastor may participate in the benefits of said funds are to be placed in Column 11 and not in Column 12. Gifts, however, for the seven and one-half percent pension premiums of Foreign Missionaries are to be placed in Column 12, and should be in addition to the Church's pledge for missionaries' maintenance.

5. *Service Pension Fund*.—To include all monies paid in on account of subscriptions to Service Pension Fund.

6. *To include all monies contributed to the American Bible Society.*

7. *To include all monies contributed to the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America.*

8. *To include all monies paid to benevolent causes for which no deduction is to be drawn off in the columns of this page. In this column are to be placed all monies paid to Interdenominational, Undenominational causes like the Near East Relief, the Y. M. C. A., the W. Y. C. A., the Lord's Day Alliance, Hospitals (whether denominational or not), Homes, Orphanages, Temperance and Reform Organizations, also to Interdenominational or Undenominational causes like The China Inland Mission, The New Guinea Evangelization Society, The Mission to London.*

9. *Individual Gifts*.—If the elders definitely approve, the direct gifts of individuals to any of the boards or to the causes they represent, should be reported with other gifts in this column. Individual gifts for religious and charitable causes not included in the above outline should also be placed in this column when the givers definitely approve.

IV. Resident and Non-Resident Members. Book of Discipline, Chapter VII, Section 20 reads, "The roll of communicant members shall be divided into two classes, resident, to include all its members; namely, resident and non-resident. Resident members shall be construed to include all members whose legal residence is within the bounds of the congregation or who regularly attend upon or support its worship. Non-resident members shall include all those members who both legally reside beyond the bounds of the congregation and do not attend upon or support its worship; but who should not, in the judgment of the Session, be placed upon the suspended Roll." The net total of communicants reported must include both classes.

V. Definitions of the words used in this report. The Every Member Plan can be an offering for both church support and benevolence secured by subscriptions from the members individually, on a weekly basis, through an annual canvas of the whole congregation. (General Assembly Minutes 1917, p. 56)

VI. Candidates for the Ministry. Only candidates who have been received under the care of Presbytery are to be reported.
