PREFACE.

The "Form of Government" of the Presbyterian Church, in Chapter IX, Section VIII, directs that "every Session shall keep a *Book* of *Minutes* ; which record shall be, at least once in every year, submitted to the inspection of the Presbytery."

Notwithstanding this strong, positive, and necessary provision in favor of every Session, it has been the method of keeping these records. There is almost a total lack of uniformity in the form of these books, and where they are inserted,

it is with the desire of aiding to do away these evils, by presenting to the Church a model volume of Sessional Records, that the Board of Publication has, at the request of a number of Ministers, and of Presbyteries, prepared this book. It should be kept by a Clerk appointed by the Session, and the entries be made in a neat and legible hand; the necessity for interlineations and corrections being avoided.

A CHURCH REGISTRY has likewise been prepared. As it is not required to be annually carried to Presbytery for inspection and approval, and as it may not be filed at the same time with the book of Minutes, it seems best that it should usually be a separate volume. Still, the two may be obtained bound together or apart.

Specimen of Records.

For the benefit of inexperienced Clerks of Sessions, we present the following, which will exhibit the proper method of making entries, upon a number of the commonest matters to be recorded.

JANUARY, 1855.

1855.

Sept. 17th.

The Session met at the Parsonage at 3 o'clock, P. M. Present, Rev. James S., the Moderator, with Elders John W., James S., and Thomas W. The meeting was opened with prayer. The minutes of the last meeting were read.

Elder S. and Mrs. Eliza F. (wife of David) appeared before Session and were examined on their religious experience, when, having made a satisfactory profession of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, they were admitted to the sealing ordinance of the Lord's Supper. J. K. and T. H. after due examination, were admitted to the sealing ordinances of Baptism and the Lord's Supper.

A free conversation was held upon the state of religion in the congregation, from which it appeared that there was much cause for gratitude and encouragement.

It having appeared that Common Fane charges Henry A. with unchristian conduct in several particulars, the Moderator and Elder W. were appointed a Committee to wait upon Mr. A. upon the subject, and report to the Session at its next meeting.

Charles T. appeared before the Session and preferred certain charges against Samuel L. After hearing the charges, the Session directed its clerk to give the accused a copy of the same, with the names of the witnesses to support them, and to cite all concerned to appear at the next meeting of the Judiciary.

Elder John W. was appointed to attend the approaching meeting of the Presbytery.

Closed with prayer.

April 17. 1870.

Session met on call, opened with prayer.
Mr. C. Silver was chosen delegate to attend
the adjourned meeting of Presbytery at
Princeton April 20th. On motion it
was voted that the moderator be instructed
to inform Mr. John M. Goar, that, his
trial, on the charge of having figured
himself at the last term of court, is
postponed till after the coming term
of court, when, on the call of the ses-
sion, he will be required to answer
to the charge. Adjourned. Closed with pray-
er by the moderator.

May 7. 1870

Session met preparatory to the Communion. All present. The following named persons were received to the communion of the church, on examination, Mrs. Sarah V. Jernie, Miss Cornelie Louie, Miss May Elizabeth Emmons. The two last were required to present themselves for baptism. On motion it was unanimously
Resolved that, from May 1st to Oct 1st
the hour for morning service shall henceforth be half past ten (10 $\frac{1}{2}$) & the remainder of the year 11 O'clock. Opened & closed with prayer. Jos. S. Van Duzen, mod.

Cranbury May 29/10.
Session met on the call of moderator.
All present, opened with prayer by the
moderator. The following paper was
unanimously adopted;

Whereas Mr. John N. Dorcas, under the
charge of perjury, refused, at two different
private interviews, to converse with mem-
bers upon the subject, & subsequently at a
meeting of the Session, denied the Church the
right to call him in question "for testi-
mony given in a court of justice," & rempt-
only refused to remain until his two com-
panions were allowed to remain, &

Whereas, action upon a citation afterwards
issued, was by formal vote of Session, in ac-
cordance with the advice of Presbytery, post-
poned until the termination of the trial of
Abx. V. C. Schenck in the civil court, in
which case the alleged false testimony
was given, &

Whereas, That case has been disposed of &
Whereas, Abx. Dorcas now is only embarrassing
to the church, dishonoring to religion, & most
profoundly prejudicial to him, since his witness-
es, pupils in Princeton Institute, will be
absent at their homes after June 20th.
Therefore Resolved, That we send him
the following Note;

Action upon the citation sent
you by the Session to stand trial on
Wednesday, April 20th, on the charge of
wilful swearing to falsehood, will be

formal vote of session postponed till the ter-
mination of the trial of the state against Abx.
V. C. Schenck. Of this you were informed by
letter & were then assured that you would
be required to answer that citation. The date
of Abx. V. C. Schenck having been disposed of
you are hereby notified & directed to answer
that citation by presenting yourself for trial
at the Session House, Friday, June 10th, at 2
O'clock P.M. You are cited to appear there,
show cause to the above charge & submit
to trial on the same.

Aarbury N.J. June 10/70

Session met at 26' clock P.M. All the members were present, opened with prayer by the moderator. Mr. Jacob Smedaker reported that he had duly served the citation upon Mr. John H. Doray to appear at this meeting & stand trial on the charge of false swearing. After waiting till 3 O'clock Rev. E.S. Schuch & John H. Doray, accompanied with several young men from Braintree Inst., presented themselves. The moderator informed Mr. John H. Doray that Mr. Ezekiel Silvers, the prosecutor, was present with his witnesses ready to proceed with the trial. The Rev. E.S. Schuch immediately spoke claiming the right to act as counsel for defendant. Referring to the Book of Discipline, chap. 4 sec 21, the Mod. decided that Mr. Doray had a right to the choice of any member of the Session as counsel, but no right to bring in outside assistance to manage his case. From this decision Mr. Schuch appealed to the Session. The appeal being lost the Mod. read to Mr. Doray the charge & specifications of Mr. Silvers, as follows:

I, Ezekiel Silvers, charge Mr. John H. Doray, a member of this church, with having knowingly taken oath to falsehood in testimony given in the Mid. Co. Court Feb. 4, 1870 in the case of the state versus Alex. V.C. Schuch, in

saying,

1. That in connection with Alex. V.C. Schuch he left Braintree Inst. for the fire (the burning of my barn on the evening of Dec. 16th 1870) at about 20 minutes past eight O'clock & some time after the bell of the 2nd Pres. Ch. commenced to ring.

2. That he, in connection with Alex. V.C. Schuch passed John A. Petty ~~in going to the~~ fire.

Mr. Doray was then informed that he might manage his own case, or select any member of the Session to manage it for him, the witnesses for the plaintiff would be introduced first & examined, first by Mr. E. Silvers, then cross examined by himself or counsel; that ~~his~~ witness would then be introduced, first examined by himself or counsel, then cross examined by Mr. E. Silvers; that the testimony of each witness, given under oath, would be written out in full, subscribed to by each person giving it, & certified to by the Clerk; that both the Mr. Silvers would have an opportunity of commenting upon the testimony, that thereupon the case might perhaps be decided by this Session, perhaps referred to Presbytery.

Mr. Doray was then asked whether he was ready to proceed with the trial. He replied, "Not unless Mr. Schuch is allowed to manage my case for me." On being again informed that the Session had decided not to allow outside counsel, he, Mr. Schuch,

Those who came with them, withdrew.
The Session resolved to issue the 2nd
citation & send it by gentleman R.C.
Stults & Arrow Lane. The following was
sent:—

Cambridge June 10th 1870

Mr John M. Dorsey; You are hereby cited to appear at the Session House before the Session of the Ins. Pres Ch. this afternoon, June 10th at 5 1/2 o'clock to stand trial on the charge made by Mr. E. Silvers of having knowingly taken oath to falsehood in testimony given in the Mass. Co. Court Feb. 4. 1870 in the case of the State against Alex. T.C. Schenck. This is the last citation ~~that~~ that will be sent you by this Session. If you do not appear at the appointed time the Session, besides punishing you for contumacy, will, if it sees fit, after assigning some one to manage your defense, proceed to take the testimony in your case as if you were present.

Lane reported that they had been

unable to find Mr. Dorsey, also that Mr. John M. Dorsey sen. had failed in finding him. The Session resolved to send the same citation, changing the date to Sat. June 11th 10 O'clock, to the accused by John M. Dorsey sen. & Mr. Jos. Farr. Closed with prayer by the Moderator.

June 11th 1870

Session met at 10 O'clock. All present opened with prayer by the Moderator. Mr. John Dorsey sen. & Mr. Jos. Farr reported that they had made numerous unsuccessful attempts to serve the citation upon Mr. John M. Dorsey; that they were told he was not in the Institute but at his father's five miles distant, that on sending for him they found he was not there & had not been seen in the village that morning; that Mr. Bloom, at their request, had made an effort to serve the citation but failed though told by Alex. Schenck that Dorsey was in the kitchen; that he had been seen in the village that morning; that Mr. Leggett, sent by them to serve the ~~citation~~ citation, was told at the Institute that John Dorsey had gone to his Uncle, John M. Dorsey's sen., two miles distant; that this, by the subsequent affirmation of Mr. J. Dorsey sen.,

was found to be untrue. All efforts having so far failed, Session resolved to cite him to appear on Monday Morning June 18th at 9 O'clock. The same citation altering the date was sent. Closed with Prayer.

June 13th 1870. Rockville.
Session met: all present, opened with prayer by the Mod. The Minutes in the Dooray case were read & approved. Mr. John Danion, a member of this Ch. reported, that at the request of members of the Session, he had made several attempts to serve the citation upon Mr. J. M. Dooray: all proved unsuccessful: that he left a citation with Rev. E. S. Schenck, requesting him to hand it to Mr. Dooray; that this was subsequently returned, Rev. E. S. Schenck declining to deliver it, or to make known the whereabouts of Mr. Dooray. Mr. Jacob Snedaker also reported that he failed in serving the citation given him, being unable to find Mr. Dooray, or learn where he was. Mr. Am. Gied, a member of the Ch., who had been requested to serve the citation, made a similar report. On Motion, Resolved that the same citation, altering the date to June 17th & P.M. be, if possible, delivered to him.

& that one for him be left with Rev. E. S. Schenck (who so far in all matters has assumed to act for Mr. Dooray) & another with his father Wm. Dooray, each accompanied with the declaration that unless Mr. John M. Dooray is present on Friday, June 17th, at 2 o'clock P.M. his trial will proceed whether or not the Session has proof of his having received the citation into his own hands.

Closed with Prayer.

Granbury, June 17, 1870.
Session met at 2 P.M. All present, opened with prayer by the Moderator. Mr. Jacob Snedaker reported that on Tuesday morning June 16, he left at Beamer's Institute for John M. Dooray, the citation issued on Monday June 13th for him to appear before the Session June 17th; that with the citation he left word that on Friday the Session would certainly proceed with the trial whether he was present or absent & without waiting for proof that he himself had personally received the written citation; that that citation was returned by Rev. E. S. Schenck being refused by Mr. Snedaker, was again returned on Thursday by Mr. Schenck (Rev. E.S.); that

he also used to sleep with Mrs. W^m. Doory, father of the defendant, the citation accompanied with the declaration that on Friday the Session would certainly proceed with the trial without waiting for positive proof that the citation had been handed to John Jr. Doory; that the defendant was believed to have been at his Father's during that entire day.

These reports having been given & the defendant not appearing Session unanimously resolved to suspend him from the communion of the church for Lentenage until he appears before Session & depelte reportance for having determinedly refused to stand trial. Resolved that the Moderator inform him by letter sent by the hand of Mr. John G. Stults; that the Prod. also inform the Pres. Com. on Education, under whose care he is, of this action.

Resolved that we proceed to take the testimony in the case, & that Mr. Snidaker be appointed to act as counsel for Mr. Doory, that the testimony be written out in full, given under oath, & subscribed to by each person giving it.

Testimony of ten witnesses was then taken in full, written out & subscribed to (See Manuscript.)

Resolved, that inasmuch as action has been brought against two members of this Session, in the civil court, for slander, & inasmuch as John Doory may even yet express a willingness to submit to trial & a desire to bring forward witness, or, that the decision of this case be postponed for the present.

Resolved that Mr. Jacob Snidaker be appointed delegate to attend the meeting of Synod at Elizabeth, Tuesday next, June 21st 1870.

Adjourned & closed with prayer.

Session met preparatory to the communion. Opened with prayer by Mr. Jacob Snidaker. Mr. John G. Stults reported having delivered a letter to Mr. Doory, of which this is a true copy.

Cranbury N.J. June 18. 1870.

Mr. John Sh. Doory;

Dear Sir;

I am directed by the Session to ~~inform~~ of the New Presbyterian Church of Cranbury to inform you that at their meeting held at 2 O'clock yesterday, for the purpose of attending to your trial

on the charge made against you by Mrs. E. Silvers of having knowingly taken oath to falsehood you were suspended from the communion of the church for contumacy until you repented. You refused at two different private interviews to communicate with us upon the subject. You determinedly refused to remain at the second interview unless your two young Juniors were allowed to be present; you denied the Session the right to call you in question for testimony given in a court of justice; you refused to submit to trial until a person not a member of the Session was allowed to manage your case, because this was not permitted, contrary to the book of Discipline, you withdrew from the meeting of Session to which you were summoned by the first citation, although the time of answering that citation had been set at the urgent of Geo. E. S. Schenck, postponed from April 30th to June 10th; finally, you neglected to answer either in person by note, or in any other way, the second citation which informed you that if you failed to be present you would be suspended for contumacy, short the session, of I saw fit, after alleging some one to manage your defense, would proceed to take the testimony in your case as if you were present. After such long continued refusal to

appear & stand trial, no option was left the Session. We were forced to suspend you for contumacy. The Book of Discipline left us no choice. Greatly did we do in still regret the necessity, earnestly do we pray that this discipline may be blessed of God to your great spiritual good.

committed we appointed to inform their
neighbors of the design of the session to
recommend them to the congregation for elec-
tion, to ascertain whether they will be willing
to serve in case of election reported
to the session to-morrow morning at 9½
o'clock. To this time the session took
access

Sunday morning 9½ o'clock. The com-
mittee reported all the above named mem-
bermen willing to allow their names to
be presented to the cong. for election.

Resolved that the session now render a decision
in the case of John M. Doray. The
testimony being read the charge stated,
the moderator asked each member (ex-
cept Mr. E. Selous, the accuser, & Mr. J.
Snedeker, counsel for defendant) "Is J.
M. Doray guilty or innocent?" Each
answered, "Guilty?" On motion unani-
mously resolved that he be suspended
from the communion of the church
until he appears in person before the
session, makes acknowledgements man-
ifestly penitent.

bury, at a meeting held yesterday, decided
your case upon the testimony taken on
Tuesday June 17th, & found you guilty of the
charge brought against you by Mr. E. Selous
& unanimously resolved that you be sus-
pended from the communion until you
appear before the session & give satisfactory evi-
dence of repentance. The decision had been
left to be delayed in the hope that you
might yet change your mind, see you did
more in refusing to submit yourself for trial,
secure a removal of the suspension for
contumacy & feel disposed of bringing forward
evidence to clear yourself of the charge. We
have waited on you almost two months.
The session unanimously resolved to wait
no longer. Hoping this action - forced upon
us by your refusal to hold any conference
with us your continued contumacy
- may be blessed of heaven to your spirit
and soul. we remain as ever.

Mershon, & present evidence of a willingness to deal honestly w/ her, but if he desired to have the matter settled, the sesh was prepared to suspend him on the charge of dishonesty as omitted in acts confessed by him — reported the duty performed. He com. also reported that Mr. & Mrs. Mershon, desired receiving from their hands a written copy of the action of sesh as taken April 3, 1887., were informed by them what its exact import was; also, reported that Mrs. Mershon insisted that she did not want her certificate & was unwilling to accept it unless one was granted to her husband; that Mr. Mershon was unchanged in feeling & indisposed to take any step towards attempting to make payment of indebtedness, or acknowledge improper treatment, but denied the sesh the right to inquire into the honesty or dishonesty of his business transactions.

The Com. having completed its report, Mr. E. Silcox informed sesh that Mr. Mershon called upon him yesterday (May 28th) & stated that neither he nor his wife understood the action of the sesh, as announced to them by Messrs. Covert & Bergen; that neither he nor his wife knew why certificates were not granted them, that they wanted both certificates or nothing, & that if sesh was unwilling to grant them they deserved them.

B. Mershon.

2. In not making payments that were usually promised.

3. In demanding stowing money from the hands of Mr. John S. Dawson (one of the commissioners for the sale of a House & Lot in Cranbury, joint property by Margaret B. & Cornelius V. Mershon) after this Mr. Dawson, he had promised the same might be

In not paying to the aforesaid mortgagors, from April 1, 1883 to April 1, 1885 (after he removed from the farm rented the same) any portion whatever of the rent, or any interest, or furnishing any products of the farm in lieu of money, or doing any work in lieu of interest, though requested to do so; & when, at his request, the mortgagors were giving him time to effect a sale of the premises, he received \$80 rent the first year rented the house & a part of the land the second year.

Mr. Shillman, on being told that the charge made against him by Common Game Law, Dishonest practice & the use of profane language, confessed to the latter but denies the former; & earnestly requested that on consideration, the session did not feel at liberty to grant him a certificate, they would give him a formal trial on the two charges.

He complained that no member of the session has ever spoken to him upon these subjects, but now, after he has denied, these charges were brought against him. Whereupon D. C. Lear, John S. Silver & Jas. S. Van Dyke asserted that they, as individuals, had spoken to him; the former admitting it. He was told that as now he asks session for a certificate & the session has, as a session, become aware of these charges, a certificate, session feels, can not be given him without mitigation.

After protracted conference Mr. Shillman repeats his request for a certificate, or a trial upon the charges; whereupon after session give him that the decision arrived at will be communicated to him.

After his withdrawal the following action was unanimously taken:

Shellenback set freely is cited to meet this session on Thursday Augt 7, 1850 at 10 O'clock A.M. in the chapel to stand trial on the charge, a copy of which has been given him.

Mr. Shellenback said, he was induced to ask the session to give him legal counsel, & had made selection of a lawyer. Being advised that our Book did not permit him outside counsel, but that he might request any member of the session to take charge of, or assist in the management of, his defense he insisted that he was entitled to a lawyer as counsel; that it would be

unfair to permit a member of the session to act as his counsel. The session, after stirring up勇气 to convince him that he had no such right under our Book of Discipline & urging him to select counsel from the session, informed him that in case he selected no counsel, was not present to conduct the case himself, counsel would be appointed for him by the session. All efforts to induce him to select a member of the session as counsel having failed, the matter was left.

Mr. Shellenback kept reciting his innocence on each of the charges, the moderator asked him, how he came then to an encroachment at the previous meeting, that he had been guilty of presumption. Whereupon he stoutly & repeatedly denied that he had made such confession; & persisted in his denial though every member who was present assured him that he certainly had made such confession.
