PREFACE

The "Form of Government" of the Presbyterian Church, in Chapter IX, Section VIII, directs that "every Session shall keep a FAIR RECORD of its proceedings; which record shall be, at least once in every year, submitted to the inspection of the Presbytery."

Notwithstanding this direction, great want of neatness and precision is found in every session of the Church, in the method of keeping these records. There is also a great lack of uniformity in the size and kind of books in which they are inscribed.

It is with the desire of aiding to do away with these evils, by presenting to the Church a model volume of Sessional Records, that the Board of Christian Education has, at the request of a number of Ministers and of Presbyteries, prepared this book. It should be kept by a clerk appointed by the Session, and the entries be made in a neat and legible hand, the necessity for interlineations and corrections being carefully avoided.

A CHURCH REGISTRY has likewise been prepared. As it is not required to be annually carried to Presbytery for inspection and approval and as it may not be filled at the same time with the book of Minutes, it seems best that it should usually be a separate volume. Still, the two may be obtained bound together or apart.

SPECIMEN OF RECORDS

For the benefit of inexperienced clerks of Sessions, we present the following, which will exhibit the proper method of making entries, upon a number of the commonest matters to be recorded:

MARCH 22D

JOHNSVILLE, MARCH 22, 1905.

The Session met at the parsonage at 3 o'clock P. M. Present, REV. JAMES SMITH the Moderator, with Elders John Williams, James Short and Thomas Winsor. The meeting was opened with prayer. The minutes of the last meeting were read.

Mr. Robert Sutherland and Mrs. Eliza Foster (wife of David) appeared before Session and were examined on their religious experience, when, having made a satisfactory profession of their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, they were received to membership. Mr. John Knight and Mr. Thomas Roberts, after due examination, were received to membership, and it was ordered that they be baptised on Sabbath morning, April 2.

A free conversation was held upon the state of religion in the congregation, from which it appeared that there was much cause for gratitude and encouragement.

It having appeared that Common Fame charges Henry Adams with unchristian conduct in several particulars, the Moderator and Elder Williams were appointed a committee to wait upon Mr. Adams upon the subject and report to Session at the next meeting.

Mr. Charles Thomas appeared before the Session and preferred certain charges against Mr. Samuel Long. After hearing the charges, the Session directed its clerk to give the accused a copy of the same with the names of the witnesses to support them, and to cite all concerned to appear at the next meeting of the judicatory.

Elder John Winsor was appointed to attend the approaching meeting of the Presbytery.

Minutes of Congregational Meeting

The congregation of the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, N.J. met, pursuant to call of the session, in the Church on Thursday evening Jan 3rd 1935, at 7:30 O'clock.

The Pastor Rev Frank B. Everett moderated the meeting, with the clerk of session as clerk of the meeting. Prayer was offered by E. S. Barclay and the Pastor.

The call for the meeting was then duly read, which is as follows.

A Congregational meeting of the Second Presbyterian Church, is hereby called to meet in said church, on Thursday Jan 3rd 1935, at 7:30 P.M. to hear the report, of the committee appointed by the joint boards of these two churches, to draft a plan of union for the merging of the First and Second Presbyterian Churches of Cranbury, N.J. and to act on the same, and on any business pertaining thereto.

The committee of Twelve, appointed by the joint Boards of the First and Second Presbyterian Churches of Cranbury, N.J. to draft a plan of union for the merging of these two churches, then presented its report, which is as follows.

The following is the plan of union upon which the merger is to be effected. The committee has had these objectives in view.

MINUTES OF SESSION.

1. Economic - The committee believes that it is neither common sense nor spiritual insight to operate the expensive plants where one would suffice.

2. Social - The Committee believes that, in a community where members of two churches freely inter-mingle in their social affairs, it would be a decided gain, if some of these occasions could be held in the church home of all rather than to divide them between two churches.

3. Spiritual - While the committee recognizes the obvious fact that different denominations, appealing to the different temperaments of mankind are desirable, it feels to see how two different groups of the same denomination, worshipping in different places in the same village, can be obtaining a spiritual influence, or receive as large spiritual benefits, as if these two groups should combine their resources and worship together in one place. With this explanation, and it found itself to be unanimous in recommending the consolidation of the two churches, the committee undertook to adjust certain of the essential matters necessary to be disposed of before the churches can unite, and it would report as follows.

The committee recommends that the first & second Presbyterian Churches of Cranbury New Jersey unite on the basis outlined below:

1. That the united church be named the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury New Jersey.

MINUTES OF SESSION.

2. That the First Church building and Chapel be used for the spiritual services of the united church.

3. That the Rev. Frank B. Ewitt be recommended to a joint meeting of the two congregations when duly called, to be formally called by Pastor, if the way be clear, with the expressed and mutual understanding that, at the end of one year from the date of said meeting, his expressed wish, freely and openly given, to return from active pastorate of the ministry, be given full and serious consideration.

4. That the legal, or official, union take place when the congregations have favorably voted on such union, and that the congregations until that date, continue to meet in the First Church for morning worship.

5. That the membership rolls of the Second Church be revised on a gonosis basis, and that the members represented by the revised list be transferred, as a body, to the membership of the first or united Church.

6. That the united church have as the board of Elders all those now serving on the board of Elders of both churches.

7. That the board of Deacons of the united church be a consolidation of the two Boards now serving the two churches.

8- That the Board of Trustees of the First Church serve as the Board of Trustees of the united Church.

9- That in so far as any society now operating within either of the Churches is concerned, the question to whether or not these societies shall consolidate or continue their own identities be left in the hands of the societies themselves, to be worked out at their own discretion and pleasure.

10- That the united Church acquire the assets and assume the liabilities of the two churches and that any disposal of the Second Church properties by the united congregation be made with primary consideration of the wishes of the former members of the Second Church. Nothing in this paragraph is intended to interfere with any funds of any organization operating with the two churches.

11- That any other matter which would normally be within the jurisdiction of the Session, or any board of either church, be referred to the joint Session, or joint Board, or the Board of Trustees as herein provided, of the United Church.

In submitting this report, the committee desires to say that on all of the decisions there has been a mutual understanding of the problems involved and a complete harmony in attempting to meet them. The Committee believes that never before have the two congregations been so close together

as they are at the present time, and if, as it feels confident, it has reflected the desire of the congregation as well as its own mature judgment in the matter, the congregation by their vote of approval, will make the union an assured fact.

The report was received and adopted by a rising vote of 102 to 6. It was later, on motion, made unanimous.

The following petition to Presbytery for that body's approval of the merger and plan was read and approved.

The petition to Presbytery includes the following points.

1- That the Presbytery approve the merger of the First and Second Presbyterian Churches of Cranbury New Jersey under the name and title of the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury New Jersey and in accordance with the following plan of union as approved by each church in congregational meeting and incorporation meeting duly called for the same, to wit: see above plan.

2- That the Presbytery declare the First Church of Cranbury New Jersey, the congregation and corporation of which result from the merger of the congregation and corporation of First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury and the congregation and corporation of the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury New Jersey to be the legal successor of said congregation and said corporations.

3. That the Presbytery authorize and direct the transfer by the session, of all members in good and regular standing of the Second Presbyterian Church in Cranbury New Jersey to the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury promptly on the consummation of the authorized union.
4. That the Presbytery authorize the trustees of the corporation, known as the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury New Jersey to transfer its property, real and personal, and its trust funds, and any and all funds on hand belonging to said Church corporation to the trustees of the Corporation known as the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury of Cranbury New Jersey if and when all legal requirements have been met.
5. That the Presbytery direct the congregations of the First and Second Presbyterian Churches of Cranbury New Jersey, to convene jointly after due notice from the pulpit as soon as the legal transfer of the property of said Second Church has been effected for the purpose of
- Formally condemning the union of said congregations
 - Formally merging the sessions of the two churches and in like manner the boards of Deacons of the two churches
 - To consider the matter of the supply of the pulpit for the immediate future subject to the approval of the Presbytery or if the way be clear to call a pastor
 - And to transact any other business necessary to carry into effect the provisions of the plan of union

6. That the Presbytery appoint the Rev. A. L. Layman to preside at said congregational meeting with the Rev. George G. Horn as his alternate

The following persons were appointed to represent this church before Presbytery and in all further negotiations with Presbytery, the second Church, or other bodies, as may be necessary for the carrying out of the merger.

WHEREAS said Plan of Union has been approved by the Presbytery of Monmouth at a meeting held in Delanco, N.J. on January 22, 1935; and

WHEREAS by said Plan of Union as approved by said Presbytery, it is among other things provided that the Trustees of the corporation known as the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, shall transfer the property, real and personal, and the trust funds and any and all funds on hand belonging to said Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, to the Trustees of the corporation known as the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey; NOW, THEREFORE:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Trustees of the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, are hereby authorized and directed to transfer and convey all the property, real and personal, of the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, to the Trustees of the corporation known as the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, and for that purpose to execute and deliver all necessary and proper assignments, deeds and other instruments.
