Special meeting of the Board of trustees was called after church service. Those present were E. Smith, Bonner, G. Miller, Bennett and Stuth. On motion the Secy was authorized to purchase a secretary book for use for the minutes. The following bills were presented, bill \$15.00 for buying the electric organ antenna fund used for six months from June 1st to Sept 1st 1912, bill for brick for Chapel \$40. Changle and Rent for chimney and site for parsonage barn off \$2.75. J. E. Day for paving plate on church and rapping \$12.96. Bill for changing stone at parsonage and furnace \$48.00. Motion the above bills were passed paid.

On motion C. Ernest L. Stuth was authorized to have the stone in Chapel changed and the water tower removed to save also make the sale of the little stone in Chapel to Miss Sewell.

Motion and carried that Section be given authority to fix leader pipe on back of church. On motion J. M. Bonner, Miller was appointed to have iron pot in concrete under two leaders of parsonage to run water off from the house.

The Motion was made and approved that for the payment of Bills, Affairs of church Property and for the ordinary transaction of business, two or more members of the Board should constitute a quorum, for all other business three should be a quorum of the full board.

agreement was drawn up and read as follows:

Pastor of Second Free Church, Party of the First Part
Mr. Ober G. Lovett Party of the Second Part
I do hereby undertake and agree, that for the
sum of One Thousand Dollars \$1000 payable semi-
annually, and 4% over Paid, the Party of the First
Part does employ as Pastor for the term of one year
from April 1st 1872 to April 1st 1873. That if Stith,
Party of the Second Part, where debarred shall be
or become. To act as Lester at all religious
services to heat and light buildings, ring bell,
bell, hand, large, swift and stated and, so far as
possible, attend on person all services.
These same conditions to apply to all other meetings
or gatherings which may be held in Church
Buildings when held under the approval of the
Party of the First Part.

Stith shall be the duty of the Party of the Second
Part to clean all water tank, keep fire, mow
all grass around church buildings, pay half the
Church Property tax a rent and tidy appearance.
At least, once a year, the Church and Chapel shall
have a thorough cleaning.

So long as each Party shall remain satisfied with
each other the contract may continue, but in
event that either Party may become dissatisfied
with the other, it shall then be the duty of the
Party dissatisfied to notify the other Party on or
before Jan 1st next, and then regardless of
dissension to take effect on the first day of April
following.

The congregation of the Second Presbyterian Church met as a corporate body, pursuant to a call of the Trustees, on Thursday, Jan. 3, immediately following a meeting of the congregation, called by the senior, for his own viewing and in the same place.

Mr. C. C. Wilson, President of the Board of Trustees, was temporary chairman, and called the meeting to order. It was moved and seconded that Mr. Samuel D. Barley be chairman, and Mr. F. H. Clifton secretary. Carried unanimously. The secretary read the following call:

December 22, 1934.

The congregation of the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury is hereby called to meet in the Second Presbyterian Church on Thursday evening, January 3, 1935, immediately following the congregational meeting, called for the same evening at 7:30 P.M. for the purpose of hearing and acting upon a report of a committee on the question of uniting the First and Second Presbyterian churches of Cranbury, and to transact all necessary business pertaining thereto.

In a matter of information and
to whom conform, only those
who have reached the age of

porative meeting.

It was moved and seconded that, as the report of the Committee of Twelve has been read at the congregational meeting, a second reading be dispensed with. Carried unanimously.

Copy of report follows:

Report of the Committee of Twelve on the uniting of the First and the Second Presbyterian Churches of Cranbury, New Jersey.

It would appear that most members of the congregation are familiar with the events leading to this present report on the proposed consolidation of the First and Second Church of Cranbury, but for the sake of record, and also of accuracy, it seems well to relate them.

The pulpit of the First Church became vacant on November

7, 1934. Our Sunday, the 11th, the Board of Deacons and Trustees of that church met and recommended to the Board of Elders, who were to meet on Monday, the 12th, that there be joint services with the Second Church, looking forward to a consolidation of the two churches.

At a later date, the Deacons of each church met and voted three Elders each to further advise on the question of the church uniting.

Believing a subject of such importance too large for them to adequately consider, these six Elders referred it to the Boards of both churches, and it was decided by these Boards to meet jointly in order to ascertain the attitude of the official representative of the churches on the question.

This joint meeting took place on November 26th. Practically the entire membership of all the Boards were present, and all persons expressed their own personal opinion on the subject. The result of the meeting was that a motion, favoring a consolidation of the two churches, was unanimously passed; and a committee of two members from each Board, of each church, were appointed to work on the vital problems involved in the union, and to report to the congregation.

The committee has appointed two sets of times. The first set was to unanimously pass a motion affirming the action of the Official Boards, November 26th. The Committee has obtained the best service possible. A representative visits Dr. Mudge and Rev. Mr. authorities on Presbyterian law, in Philadelphia, and not only obtains invaluable suggestions from him but also a new communication that our two churches in Cranbury are considering uniting. The Committee has, in addition, taken steps to obtain the best legal advice possible on church union.

Up to the point, then, the Committee would point out two things:

First - That the Official Boards of both churches, at a joint meeting, vote unanimously in favor of uniting the two churches.

Second - That the present Committee, comprising one officer from each church, appointed by the joint meeting, have the voted unanimously in favor of the union.

Continuing, the Committee has three objectives in mind:

1. Economic - The Committee believes that it is neither common sense nor spiritual insight to operate two separate plants when one would suffice.

2. Social - The Committee believes that in a community where members of two churches freely intermingle in their social affairs, it would be a decided gain if some of these occasions could be held in the church home of one rather than to divide them between two churches.

3. Spiritual - While the Committee recognizes the obvious

fact that different denominations, appealing to the different temperaments of mankind, are desirable, it feels to see how two different groups of the same denomination, worshipping in two different places in the same small village, can be as strong a spiritual influence or receive as strong spiritual benefit, as if those two groups should combine their resources and worship together in one place.

With this application, after I forced myself to be reasonable in recommending the consolidation of the two churches, the Committee undertook to adjust certain of the mutual matters necessary to be disposed of before the churches can unite, and it will read as follows:

The Committee recommends that the First and the Second Presbyterian Churches of Cranbury, New Jersey, unite on the basis outlined below:

1. That the united church be named the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey.
2. That the First Church building and chapel be used for the spiritual service of the church.
3. That the Rev. Fred B. Smith be recommended to a joint meeting of the two congregations, when duly called to be formally called as Pastor, if the way be open, will he accept and mutual understanding had, at the end of one year from the date of joint meeting, his expenses and, freely and sincerely given, to retire from the active service of the ministry, to give full and union consideration.
4. That the legal, or official, union take place when the congregations have formally voted on such union, and that the congregation, until that date, continue to meet in the First Church for morning worship.
5. That the membership rolls of the Second Church be revised on a generous basis, and that the members so represented by the revised list be transferred, as a body, to membership of the First, or united, church.
6. That the united church have, as its Board of Elders, all those now serving on the Boards of Elders of both churches.
7. That the Board of Deacons of the united church be a combination of the two Boards now serving the two churches.
8. That the Board of Trustees of the First Church

- serve as the Board of Trustees of the united church.
9. That, in so far as any society now operating within either of the churches is concerned, the question as to whether or not their societies shall, consolidate or continue their separate identity, be left in the hands of the societies themselves, to be worked out at their own discretion and pleasure.

10. That the united church assume the assets, and assume the liabilities, of the two churches; and that any disposal of the Second Church property by the united congregation be made with primary consideration of the wishes of the former members of the Second Church. Nothing in this paragraph is intended to interfere with any funds of any organization operating within the two churches.
11. That any other matter which would normally be within the jurisdiction of the Session, or of the Board, of either church, be referred to the first Session, or first Board, of the Board of Trustees, as herein provided, of the united church.

In submitting the report, the Committee desires to say that, in view of its dimensions, that he has a natural understanding of the problems involved and a complete harmony in attempting to meet them. The Committee believes that never before have the two congregations been so close together as they are at the present time and that it feels confident, it has affected the sense of the congregations, as well as its own natural judgment in the matter. The congregations, by their vote of approval, will make the union an assured fact.

The petition follows:

To the Presbytery of Monmouth,

Dear Brethren:

At a meeting of the congregations and corporations of the First and Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, the following action was taken:

That the Report of the Committee of Twelve, recommending that the First and the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, unite in the basis outlined below, be accepted.

Here follows numbered paragraphs 1-11 as above.

The said congregations and corporations, therefore, respectfully petition the Presbytery of Monmouth as follows:

I. That the Presbytery approve the merger of the First and Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, under the name and title of The First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, and in accordance with the Plan of Union as above stated and as approved by each church in congregational meeting and in corporation meeting duly called for purpose.

II. That the Presbytery declare the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, the congregation and corporation of which shall form the merger of the congregation and corporation of the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury and the congregation and corporation of the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, to be the legal successor to said congregations and corporations.

III. That the Presbytery authorize and direct the transfer by its Session of all members in good and regular standing in the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, to the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, promptly on the consummation of the above authorized union.

IV. That the Presbytery authorize the Trustees of the corporation known as the Second Presbyterian Church of Cranbury,

New Jersey, to transfer its property, real and personal, and its trust funds, and any and all funds or land belonging to said church corporation to the trustees of the corporation known as the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, & and where all legal arguments have been met.

I. That the Presbytery direct the congregations of the First and Second Presbyterian Churches of Cranbury, New Jersey, to consider promptly after due notice from the pulpits or soon as the legal transfer of the property of said Second Church has been effected, for the purpose of:

(1) Formally communitating the union of said congregations;

(2) Formally merging the histories of the two churches and in like manner the Books of Discipline of the two churches;

(3) To consider the matter of the supply of the pulpit for the immediate future, subject to the approval of the Presbytery, & if the way be clear, to call a Pastor;

(4) And to transact any other business necessary to carry into effect the provisions of the Plan of Union.

II. That the Presbytery appoint the Rev. A. H. Haynes to preside at said congregational meeting, with the Rev. Mr. S. Howie as his alternate.

The Presbytery of Morristown is further respectfully informed that at the congregational and corporate meetings of the First Presbyterian Church of Cranbury, New Jersey, the following were authorized on behalf of said congregation and corporation to sign and present the petition to the Presbytery:

Furthermore, your petitioners hereby request of Presbytery to authorize any further procedure not set forth in this petition which, in the judgment of the Presbytery, is essential or desirable in effecting the merger provided for in the above Plan of Union.

Respectfully submitted.

The Minutes of the Corporation meeting continue.

It was regularly moved and seconded that therefore, respectively, namely, Mr. E. S. Berkeley, Mr. C. A. Allen, Mr. J. D. Bennett & Mr. H. H. Corcoran, Deacons; Mr. C. A. Wilson, Trustee; who represents this church as the joint committee of the two churches, continue to act as the committee from this church to carry the Plan through to completion. Carries unanimously.

The following Resolution was read and approved:

Resolved, that the Trustees of this church be authorized to deed the lands of the Cemetery, known as Westminister Cemetery, together with all the Cemetery funds, to a corporation whose name we a late date.

Mr. G. A. Bennett and Mr. Daniel Dawson, sent as a committee from the First Church, announced that their body had approved, almost unanimously, the merger.

It was regularly moved and seconded that Mr. E. C. Wilson and Mr. C. A. Allen be appointed a committee from this church to advise the First Church as regards of this meeting. Carries unanimously.

(As a matter of record, the vote taken with reference to merging with the First Church was 101 for to 6 against. One of the minority then moved to make the vote unanimous. This was seconded and carried unanimously).

The Minutes of this meeting were read to the Corporation and approved. Adjourned there regularly followed. C. A. Allen, Secy.

February 17, 1935.
A meeting of the Board of Trustees was held after the morning service at the First Church.

It was moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Mr. Applegate, that the secretary notify Mr. Fuller that, due to the consolidation of the two churches, his services as sexton will not be required after April 1, 1935. — Carried unanimously.

The secretary was instructed to notify the two rectors & parishes belonging to the church, Mr. Brink and Mr. Wilson, respectively, that after April 1st the rent is to be paid to the Board of Trustees of the First Church.

The secretary was also instructed to notify Mr. Norman H. Wright, President of the Board of Trustees of the First Church, that after Sunday, February 24th, 1935, the Board of the First Church may use any of the furniture, etc., of the Second Church Chapel which they may require, that day being the last Sunday previous to uniting the two Sunday schools in the First Church and Chapel.

The meeting adjourned by common consent.

It was moved by Mr. Wilson, seconded by Mr. Snyder, that the memorial windows of the chapel be covered on the outside with wire for protection, and the Treasurer be authorized to pay the cost.

Adjournment was by common consent at 10:00 P.M.
